Key Points:

- The Minister has delegated you as decision maker for this matter.
- On 30 November 2010 a delegate of the Minister approved the extension of an open cut coal mine, development of Ulan West underground mine and modification or construction of new infrastructure associated with these operations at Ulan, NSW. <u>Attachment C</u>.
- Condition 2 of the EPBC approval for this project requires the proponent, Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML), to register a legally binding conservation covenant in perpetuity over Bobadeen Offset Area and Bobadeen East Offset Area as described in Appendix 1 of the EPBC approval. This is to offset impacts on the listed White Box – Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands threatened ecological community, and foraging habitat of the listed Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large – eared Pied Bat.
- Additionally, condition 4 of the approval requires UCML to provide a legally binding conservation mechanism for the long term protection of the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area as described in Appendix 1 of the EPBC approval. The conservation mechanism must be agreed to in writing by the department and finalised within 2 years of the date of the approval. These conservation areas are required to offset the impacts on the Large – eared Pied Bat.
- Under the current approval, conditions 2 and 4 require that these covenants must be registered within 2 years of the date of the approval, therefore making them due by no later than 30 November 2012.

 On 30 November 2012 the proponent wrote to the department formally requesting a variation to approval conditions 2 and 4 to extend the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements to 31 May 2013. <u>Attachment D</u>.

Background:

- On 6 November 2012 UCML wrote to an out-posted officer from the NSW Assessments Section of the department, proposing to enter into a Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) under the National Parks & Wildlife Act 1974 to satisfy both the State and Commonwealth conditions of approval. Further, UCML requested an extension of time in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval. <u>Attachment E</u>.
- As the project was being actively managed in Approvals Monitoring, the above letter was forwarded onto the Approvals Monitoring North Section (AMN) for appropriate action.
- On 22 November 2012 AMN wrote back to UCML(Attachment F), advising them that:
 - On 21 June 2011 the department had received a similar letter from Mr Jamie Lees, the previous Environment & Community Manager of the Ulan Complex. This letter had requested an extension until December 2011 in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval, noting that this extension of time would "allow for the relevant meetings between DoPI and the Department to occur and agree on a preferred approach to securing offsets". At the time, the department had advised Mr Lees that no extension was necessary, given that UCML had until 30 November 2012 to finalise the conservation mechanisms;
 - Since June 2011, there had been no further communication with the department in relation to registering covenants over the required offset areas, nor any indication of potential delays associated with doing so, until the email dated 6 November 2012;
 - the department cannot make a decision to extend this timeframe without first receiving a formal, written request to vary the approval conditions; and
 - When requesting a variation UCML need to demonstrate that a change to the conditions, specifically conditions 2 and 4 of the approval, is necessary or convenient for:
 - a) protecting a protected matter for which the approval has effect; or
 - b) repairing or mitigating actual or likely damage to a protected matter for which the approval has effect (whether or not the damage has been, will be or is likely to be caused by the action).
- On 30 November 2012 a formal request was received from UCML to vary approval conditions 2 and 4. This correspondence noted that UCML remained committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable but before proceeding further had been waiting for the VCA to be formally accepted as an appropriate mechanism and the content of the VCA approved by NSW and Commonwealth departments.

UCML stated that this had been intended to occur via a joint agency meeting to be organised by the Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DP&I). UCML noted that they had again raised the matter of the proposed joint agency meeting with DP&I, who, last week, had undertaken to prioritise the matter. Therefore, delays in registering all required offset covenants have been attributed to DP&I and do not appear to have been caused by UCML. <u>Attachment D</u>.

 On 10 December 2012 AMN provided UCML with a copy of the draft variation notice for their consideration. UCML replied the same day, noting their agreement to the proposed wording of the variation notice. <u>Attachment G</u>.

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- Officers of the Approvals Monitoring North Section have considered the proposed variations and are satisfied that an extension to the timeframe will not only bring UCML into compliance but will also allow them to achieve protection of the areas required under the conditions of approval. While a non compliance (infringement notice) could possibly have been pursued for failure to secure the offsets within the required timeframe, the formal request for the variation was received on the same day as the offsets were required to be secured and this course of action would not achieve protection of the protected matters. Accordingly, the variation is considered necessary and convenient for the protection of the matters of national environmental significance under Section 143(c)(i) of the EPBC Act.
- AMN therefore recommend that you approve the variations to Conditions 2 and 4 of the EPBC approval and sign the Variation Notice at <u>Attachment A</u> and the letter to UCML advising of your decision at <u>Attachment B</u>.

 The person taking the action must not clear more than 69 hectares of White Box – Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands ecological community in the project area.

2. To offset impacts on the listed White Box – Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands threatened ecological community, and foraging habitat of the listed Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large – eared Pied Bat, the person taking the action must register a legally binding conservation covenant in perpetuity over Bobadeen Offset Area and Bobadeen East Offset Area as described in Appendix 1. The covenants must be registered within 2 years of the date of this approval and covenant conditions must ensure that management is for the protection and enhancement of the matters of national environmental significance identified above.

3. To offset the impacts to the White Box – Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands ecological community, and to the habitat for the Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large – eared Pied Bat, the person taking the action must, before commencement of operations (excluding first workings), obtain the Minister's approval of an Offset Management Plan for the Bobadeen and the Bobadeen East Offset Area.

This plan must include details of:

- measures for the long-term protection of the established White Box Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands ecological community and habitat for the Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large – eared Pied Bat;
- f. measures to monitor subsidence and any proposed remediation works should subsidence occur;
- g. the timing responsibilities and performance criteria for such actions;

The conservation mechanism must be agreed to in writing by the Department and must be finalised within 2 years of the date of this approval.

If the conservation mechanism cannot be finalised within 2 years of the date of this approval, the proponent must submit for the Minister's approval an alternative offset within 3 years of the date of this approval. The alternative offset must provide at least an equivalent environmental outcome to those specified under condition 5.

 To offset the impacts on the Large – eared Pied Bat, the person taking the action must, before commencement of operations, (excluding first workings), obtain the Minister's approval of an Offset Management Plan for the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area.

This plan must include details of:

- a. the desired outcomes/objectives of implementing the plan;
- details of the Brokenback Conservation Area, clearly define the location and boundaries of the Brokenback Conservation Area, through maps and / or textual descriptions as well as an accompanying *shapefile*;
- details of the Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area, clearly define the location and boundaries of the Spring Gully Line Management Area, through maps and / or textual descriptions as well as an accompanying *shapefile*;
- management actions that are proposed to protect areas and to enhance their value to Large – eared Pied Bat including weed control, fire management, erosion and sediment control, livestock management, and restrictions on access;
- e. measures for the long-term protection of these areas;
- f. the timing responsibilities and performance criteria for such actions;
- g. the development and implementation of a monitoring program;
- h. a process to report to the department the offset area management actions undertaken and the outcome of those actions, identifying any need for improved management. For the five years after the commencement of operations, reports are to be submitted annually on or before the anniversary of the commencement of operations. Subsequently reports are to be submitted every fifth year on or before the anniversary of the commencement of operations;
- a description of the potential risks to successful management and rehabilitation in the offset areas, and a description of the contingency measures that would be implemented to mitigate these risks; and
- j. details of parties responsible for monitoring, reviewing and implementing the plan.

The approved Offset Management Plan must be implemented. Any changes to the Offset Management Plan must be approved by the Minister and approved variations to the Plan must be implemented. This plan may be made publicly available on the internet by the Department.

- 6. Within 14 days after commencement of operations, the person taking the action must advise the Department in writing of the actual date of commencement of operations.
- 7. On or before every 12 month anniversary of the commencement of the operations, the person taking the action must submit to the Department an annual report addressing compliance with the conditions of this approval. Thank you for your email (below) and the attached letter of 6 November 2012 to **s22** I from the NSW Assessments Section of the Department of Environment, Water, Population and Communities (the department). As advised in our letter dated 5 April 2011 (attached), your project is now in the post-approval phase and the Approvals Monitoring North Section is the point of contact for all communication with the department. As such, **s22**: has kindly passed your request on to me for consideration.

I note from the letter attached to your email that Ulan Coal Mines Limited is proposing to enter into a Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA)under the National Parks & Wildlife Act 1974 to satisfy both the State and Commonwealth conditions of approval. Further, Ulan Coal Mines Limited is requesting an

extension of time to in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval.

As you are aware, EPBC approval conditions 2 and 4 require that a legally binding conservation covenant must be registered on the four offset sites: Bobadeen; Bobadeen East; Brokenback; and Spring Gully. Covenant conditions must ensure that each of the offset areas is managed in perpetuity for the protection and enhancement of the specified matters of national environmental significance, as identified in the approval conditions. Additionally, both condition 2 and 4 require that all covenants must be registered within two years of the date of the approval, therefore by no later than 30 November 2012.

I note that on 21 June 2011 the department received a similar letter from Mr Jamie Lees, the previous Environment & Community Manager of the Ulan Complex. This letter requested an extension until December 2011 in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval, noting that this extension of time would "allow for the relevant meetings between DoPI and the Department to occur and agree on a preferred approach to securing offsets". At the time, the department advised Mr Lees that no extension was necessary, given that Ulan Coal Mines Limited had until 30 November 2012 to finalise the conservation mechanisms (letter attached).

Since June 2011, there appears to have been no further communication with the department in relation to registering covenants over the required offset areas, nor any indication of potential delays associated with doing so, until your recent email dated 6 November 2012. Please note that the intent of the approval decision was for the four Offset areas to be secured by no later than 30 November 2012 and given the two years that has been available to do so, the department cannot make a decision to extend this timeframe without first receiving a formal, written request to vary the approval conditions.

Approval conditions are developed in consultation with the proponent and are usually flexible enough to encompass any reasonably foreseeable events. Ulan Coal Mines Limited should note that varying the conditions of approval is not a common process and the decision maker is under no obligation to grant requests for variation, and under no obligation to consider the request within a defined timeframe.

Under s143(c) of the EPBC Act, if a variation to a condition is requested by the approval holder, the approval holder must justify the proposed variation on one of the available grounds. In this case, Ulan Coal Mines Ltd will need to demonstrate that a change to the conditions, specifically conditions 2 and 4 of the approval, is necessary or convenient for:

• protecting a protected matter for which the approval has effect; or

• repairing or mitigating actual or likely damage to a protected matter for which the approval has effect (whether or not the damage has been, will be or is likely to be caused by the action).

In requesting a variation to the approval conditions, Ulan Coal Mines Ltd must address at a minimum the following points:

- the details of the proposed variations;
- the reasons for the variations;
- specific dates by which Ulan Coal Mines Ltd will have all associated offset covenants registered; and
- any suggested wording for the varied conditions.

Once we have received the necessary information to make an informed decision on the variation request, the Approvals Monitoring North Section will put together a brief for the consideration of the Minister or his delegate.

I am writing to provide additional information to Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML) letter to the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities (SEWPaC) on 2 November 2012 and to seek a variation of a condition of approval EPBC 2009/5252 pursuant to section 143 of the *Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (Cth). Specifically, UCML seeks an extension to the requirement to register a legally binding conservation covenant in perpetuity over its offset areas (Bobadeen, Bobadeen East, Brokenback and Spring Gully) by 30 November 2012.

Condition 43, schedule 3 of UCML's Project Approval (PA08_0184) granted by the NSW Minister for Planning also requires UCML to make suitable arrangements to provide appropriate long term security for the offset areas by the end of November 2012. UCML has made concerted efforts to meet this timeframe and, via its parent company Xstrata Coal NSW (XCN), has been consulting with the NSW Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DP&I) on this matter since late 2011 to ascertain the NSW government's preferred process for providing for conservation of offset areas in perpetuity.

Following our detailed consideration of possible conservation options, it is proposed to enter into a Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act* 1974 (NSW) (NPW Act) for the relevant XCN operations which are required to implement biodiversity conservation arrangements, including UCML. This will provide for a common approach across XCN to meet both State and Commonwealth (where applicable) conditions of approval.

The attached draft VCA template was prepared by XCN for discussion with the NSW DP&I, NSW Office of Environment and Heritage and SEWPaC. At a meeting with DP&I on 5 October 2012 to present the draft VCA template it was agreed that DP&I would arrange a further meeting with OEH, SEWPAC and XCN to discuss the proposed VCA mechanism and content of the VCA. The DP&I has not yet organised that meeting.

UCML remains strongly committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable, however before proceeding further has been waiting for the VCA to be formally accepted as an appropriate mechanism and the content of the VCA approved by NSW and Commonwealth Departments. This was intended to occur via the proposed joint agency meeting which was to be organised by the DP&I.



We have discussed the matter further with the DP&I this week (specifically the proposed joint agency meeting) and were advised that the DP&I will prioritise this matter. However, notwithstanding the proposed meeting UCML is available to discuss the attached VCA directly with SEWPaC upon request. In consideration of the above, UCML seeks a variation of the conditions to approval EPBC 2009/5252 which has the effect of extending the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements to 31 May 2013.

The specific variations requested are to replace the words "2 years" with "30 months" in conditions 2 and 4 of approval EPBC 2009/5252.

Further to the matter of offset perpetuity, UCML have undertaken a significant monitoring program to incorporate the additional offset areas required by the decision of the NSW Land and Environment Court of 4 April 2011 (which had the effect of replacing the original Project Approval granted by the NSW Government with a new Project Approval for UCML). UCML submitted a revised Biodiversity Management Plan (BMP) and Offset Management Program (OMP) to the DP&I on 17 August 2012. UCML apologises for the delay, and we now refer the BMP and OMP revised plans for the consideration of the SEWPaC. UCML appreciates your feedback and will address any comments as required. Any changes to the management plans will be re-submitted to DP&I for its consideration. As per the requirements of the UCML Environmental Management Strategy, any changes made within the Management Plans have been made in red text for ease of identification.

I note from the letter attached to your email that Ulan Coal Mines Limited is proposing to enter into a Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) under the National Parks & Wildlife Act 1974 to satisfy both the State and Commonwealth conditions of approval. Further, Ulan Coal Mines Limited is requesting an extension of time to in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval.

As you are aware, EPBC approval conditions 2 and 4 require that a legally binding conservation covenant must be registered on the four offset sites: Bobadeen; Bobadeen East; Brokenback; and Spring Gully. Covenant conditions must ensure that each of the offset areas is managed in perpetuity for the protection and enhancement of the specified matters of national environmental significance, as identified in the approval conditions. Additionally, both condition 2 and 4 require that all covenants must be registered within two years of the date of the approval, therefore by no later than 30 November 2012.

I note that on 21 June 2011 the department received a similar letter from Mr Jamie Lees, the previous Environment & Community Manager of the Ulan Complex. This letter requested an extension until December 2011 in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval, noting that this extension of time would "allow for the relevant meetings between DoPI and the Department to occur and agree on a preferred approach to securing offsets". At the time, the department advised Mr Lees that no extension was necessary, given that Ulan Coal Mines Limited had until 30 November 2012 to finalise the conservation mechanisms (letter attached).

Since June 2011, there appears to have been no further communication with the department in relation to registering covenants over the required offset areas, nor any indication of potential delays associated with doing so, until your recent email dated 6 November 2012. Please note that the intent of the approval decision was for the four Offset areas to be secured by no later than 30 November 2012 and given the two years that has been available to do so, the department cannot make a decision to extend this timeframe without first receiving a formal, written request to vary the approval conditions.

Approval conditions are developed in consultation with the proponent and are usually flexible enough to encompass any reasonably foreseeable events. Ulan Coal Mines Limited should note that varying the conditions of approval is not a common process and the decision maker is under no obligation to grant requests for variation, and under no obligation to consider the request within a defined timeframe.

Under s143(c) of the EPBC Act, if a variation to a condition is requested by the approval holder, the approval holder must justify the proposed variation on one of the available grounds. In this case, Ulan Coal Mines Ltd will need to demonstrate that a change to the conditions, specifically conditions 2 and 4 of the approval, is necessary or convenient for:

• protecting a protected matter for which the approval has effect; or

• repairing or mitigating actual or likely damage to a protected matter for which the approval has effect (whether or not the damage has been, will be or is likely to be caused by the action).

In requesting a variation to the approval conditions, Ulan Coal Mines Ltd must address at a minimum the following points:

- the details of the proposed variations;
- the reasons for the variations;
- specific dates by which Ulan Coal Mines Ltd will have all associated offset covenants registered; and
- any suggested wording for the varied conditions.

Once we have received the necessary information to make an informed decision on the variation request, the Approvals Monitoring North Section will put together a brief for the consideration of the Minister or his delegate.

Since June 2011, there appears to have been no further communication with the department in relation to registering covenants over the required offset areas, nor any indication of potential delays associated with doing so, until your recent email dated 6 November 2012. Please note that the intent of the approval decision was for the four Offset areas to be secured by no later than 30 November 2012 and given the two years that has been available to do so, the department cannot make a decision to extend this timeframe without first receiving a formal, written request to vary the approval conditions.

Approval conditions are developed in consultation with the proponent and are usually flexible enough to encompass any reasonably foreseeable events. Ulan Coal Mines Limited should note that varying the conditions of approval is not a common process and the decision maker is under no obligation to grant requests for variation, and under no obligation to consider the request within a defined timeframe.

Under s143(c) of the EPBC Act, if a variation to a condition is requested by the approval holder, the approval holder must justify the proposed variation on one of the available grounds. In this case, Ulan Coal Mines Ltd will need to demonstrate that a change to the conditions, specifically conditions 2 and 4 of the approval, is necessary or convenient for:

· protecting a protected matter for which the approval has effect; or

• repairing or mitigating actual or likely damage to a protected matter for which the approval has effect (whether or not the damage has been, will be or is likely to be caused by the action).

In requesting a variation to the approval conditions, Ulan Coal Mines Ltd must address at a minimum the following points:

- the details of the proposed variations;
- the reasons for the variations;
- specific dates by which Ulan Coal Mines Ltd will have all associated offset covenants registered; and
- any suggested wording for the varied conditions.

Once we have received the necessary information to make an informed decision on the variation request, the Approvals Monitoring North Section will put together a brief for the consideration of the Minister or his delegate.

Key Points:

- The Minister has delegated you as decision maker for this matter.
- On 30 November 2010 a delegate of the Minister approved the extension of an open cut coal mine, development of Ulan West underground mine and modification or construction of new infrastructure associated with these operations at Ulan, NSW. <u>Attachment C</u>.
- Condition 2 of the EPBC approval for this project requires the person to whom the approval is granted, Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML), to register a legally binding
- conservation covenant in perpetuity over Bobadeen Offset Area and Bobadeen East Offset Area as described in Appendix 1 of the EPBC approval. This is to offset impacts on the listed White Box – Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands threatened ecological community, and foraging habitat of the listed Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large – eared Pied Bat.
- Additionally, condition 4 of the approval requires UCML to provide a legally binding conservation mechanism for the long term protection of the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area as described in Appendix 1 of the EPBC approval. The conservation mechanism must be agreed to in writing by the department and finalised within 2 years of the date of the approval. These conservation areas are required to offset the impacts on the Large – eared Pied Bat.
- On 24 December 2012 the department approved variations to conditions 2 and 4 to extend the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements to 31 May 2013.
 <u>Attachment C</u>.
- On 30 April 2013 UCML wrote to the department formally requesting a variation to approval conditions 2 and 4 to further extend the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements to 31 December 2013. <u>Attachment D</u>.

Background:

- On 6 November 2012 UCML wrote to an out-posted officer from the NSW Assessments Section of the department, proposing to enter into a Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) under the National Parks & Wildlife Act 1974 to satisfy both the State and Commonwealth conditions of approval. Further, UCML requested an extension of time in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval. As the project was being actively managed in Approvals Monitoring, this letter was forwarded onto the Approvals Monitoring North Section (AMN) for appropriate action. <u>Attachment E</u>.
- On 30 November 2012 a formal request was received from UCML to vary approval conditions 2 and 4. This correspondence noted that UCML remained committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable but before proceeding further had been waiting for the VCA to be formally accepted as an appropriate mechanism and the content of the VCA approved by NSW and Commonwealth departments. <u>Attachment F</u>.
- UCML stated that this had been intended to occur via a joint agency meeting to be
 organised by the Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DP&I). UCML noted that they
 had again raised the matter of the proposed joint agency meeting with DP&I, who, last
 week, had undertaken to prioritise the matter. Therefore, delays in registering all required
 offset covenants have been attributed to DP&I and do not appear to have been caused by
 UCML. <u>Attachment F.</u>
- A meeting between the NSW Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DP&I), the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH), UCML's parent company Xstrata Coal NSW (XCN) and the out-posted officer from the department was held in Sydney on 18 December 2012 to discuss options for securing acceptable covenants over offset areas. During the meeting, OEH indicated that they would like XCN to pursue Bio-banking agreements to secure the offsets already in their possession. OEH officers indicated that this process would be likely to take 6 to 12 months to complete. Attachment G.
- Based on the above information, a variation to conditions 2 and 4 was approved on 24 December 2012. This variation extended the proposed timeframes for implementation of the conservation arrangements for an additional 6 months to 31 May 2013. <u>Attachment C</u>.
- UCML have confirmed that they are continuing to actively manage the offsets associated with the EPBC approval and are undertaking all management activities as specified in the approved Biodiversity, Rehabilitation and Offset Management Plan. <u>Attachment H</u>.
- While UCML appear committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable, they continue to be delayed by negotiations with both the DP&I and OEH as to the most appropriate mechanism. UCML therefore wrote to the department on 30 April 2013 formally requesting a variation to approval conditions 2 and 4 to further extend the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements to 31 December 2013.

This letter noted that on 15 March 2013 DP&I advised UCML that the Director-General had granted an extension for securing the offset areas required under NSW State Project Approval 08_0184 to 31 December 2013. <u>Attachment D</u>.

 On 16 May 2013 AMN provided UCML with a copy of the draft variation notice for their consideration. UCML replied the same day, noting their agreement to the proposed wording of the variation notice. <u>Attachment I</u>.

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- AMN officers have considered the proposed variations and are satisfied that an extension to the timeframe will align the timing of both Federal and State approval requirements and allow UCML to achieve protection of the areas required under the conditions of approval. Accordingly, the variation of conditions is considered necessary and convenient for the protection of the matters of national environmental significance under Section 143(c) (i) of the EPBC Act.
- AMN therefore recommend that you approve the variations to Conditions 2 and 4 of the EPBC approval and sign the Variation Notice at <u>Attachment A</u> and the letter to UCML advising of your decision at <u>Attachment B</u>.

Sorry I didn't get back to you after the meeting on the 18th. The time just disappeared and then it was Christmas and I've been on leave since. I'll be in Canberra from tomorrow for four days and will come and speak to you personally. I sent an email to **\$22** on Friday – with a quick summary but for your purposes see notes below:

Meeting 18th December 2012

Attendants: Nigel Charnock (Xstrata) D O'Brien(Xstrata) **\$47F** (Manager Mining – DP&I) **\$47F** (Manager Biodiversity Conservation – OEH) **\$22** (SEWPaC)

There were a number of other govt officers from both DP&I and OEH but **S47F** and were making the decisions.

The meeting was coordinated by DP&I, to talk through the issues that Xstrata (and other mining companies) are having getting secure covenants over offsets in NSW. The Planning Assessment Commission has been recommending in their reports that mining companies use Vegetation Conservation Agreements (VCAs) to secure protection in the long term. OEH does not agree with using VCAs as a mechanism for protecting mining offsets. VCAs were no established to be used in this way and they do not believe they provide security into the longer term.

OEH would like mining companies to pursue Bio-banking agreements to secure offsets already in their possession. In practical terms – OEH, in consultation with the company, will determine an amount of money that would cover the protection and management of the nominated offset over a 20-30 year period. The company pays the money into the Environment Trust up front and an annuity is paid to the landholder to manage the land for conservation. The land is protected under State legislation (for conservation) and there is money to fund the management of the land

The long term. Under this scenario the mining companies could actually sell their offset lands to interested third parties who may be keen to manage land for conservation with \$ attached.

Re the Xstrata offsets - it is envisaged it will take 6 -12 months to put this arrangement in place. NSW Govt and Xstrata would like the Aust Govt to consider varying the conditions for securing long-term protection for the Ulan mine offsets (and Ravensworth I presume) to enable the bio-banking arrangements to be put in place. This will involve calculating the costs of managing the land for the long term including any improvements that are required under the approval conditions. Under the biobanking legislation – the landholder is legally responsible for any requirements set out under the agreement including maintaining biodiversity values, improving biodiversity values and reporting annually to govt.

My input was to say that the AG would support mechanisms for protection that are robust and contribute effectively to biodiversity outcomes and are consistent with the EPBC offset policy. I stressed that the proponents would need to speak to the Post Approvals area of the dept (you guys) as a priority and provide more detail for our dept to consider and ensure that all appropriate variation requests are submitted with an eye to relevant due dates (i.e. Ravensworth). I also stressed the importance of NSW Govt communicating their policy position (i.e. preference for bio-banking) to the dept and to provide more detail on how this would work and how it will meet EPBC requirements.

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Note: at officer level at least DP&I seem to be supportive of OEHs approach and at this meeting OEH agreed to develop a policy paper on offsets and bio-banking which would guide governments and the Planning Assessment Commission when making determinations. The timing for this is likely to be about 6 months. It is unlikely there will be minutes for this meeting but if there are I'll forward them.

Let me know when is a good time to talk with you this week and we can book a meeting. Apologies again for the delay in communicating – the meeting happened at the worst time. thanks


Key Points:

- The Minister has delegated you as decision maker for this matter under section 515 of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999.
- On 30 November 2010 a delegate of the Minister approved the extension of an open cut coal mine, development of Ulan West underground mine and modification or construction of new infrastructure associated with these operations at Ulan, NSW. <u>Attachment C</u>.
- Condition 2 of the approval for this project requires the person to whom the approval is granted, Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML), to register a legally binding conservation covenant in perpetuity over the Bobadeen and Bobadeen East Offset Areas, as described in Appendix 1 of the approval. This is to offset impacts on the listed White Box – Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands threatened ecological community, and foraging habitat of the listed Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large – eared Pied Bat.
- Additionally, condition 4 of the approval requires UCML to provide a legally binding conservation mechanism for the long term protection of the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area as described in Appendix 1 of the approval. The conservation mechanism must be agreed to in writing by the department and finalised within 2 years of the date of the approval. These conservation areas are required to offset the impacts on the Large – eared Pied Bat.

On 2 November 2012 UCML wrote to an out-posted officer of the NSW Assessments Section of the department, proposing to enter into a Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) under the *National Parks & Wildlife Act 1974* to satisfy both the State and Commonwealth conditions of approval. Further, UCML requested an extension of time in order to finalise the process for protection in perpetuity of the offsets relating to the approval. <u>Attachment D</u>.

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- On 30 November 2012 a formal request was received from UCML to vary approval conditions 2 and 4. This correspondence noted that UCML remained committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable but was awaiting the VCA to be formally accepted as an appropriate mechanism and for the content of the VCA to be approved by NSW and Commonwealth departments. <u>Attachment E</u>.
- A meeting between the NSW Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DP&I), the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH), UCML's parent company Xstrata Coal NSW (XCN) and the out-posted departmental officer was held in Sydney on 18 December 2012 to discuss options for securing acceptable covenants over offset areas. During the meeting, OEH indicated that they would like XCN to pursue a Bio-banking agreement over the offsets already in their possession. OEH officers indicated that this process would likely take 6 to 12 months to complete. <u>Attachment F</u>.
- Based on the above information, on 24 December 2012 you approved a variation to conditions 2 and 4. This variation extended the proposed timeframes for implementation of the conservation arrangements for an additional 6 months to 31 May 2013. <u>Attachment G</u>
- While UCML claim to be committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable, they continue to be delayed by negotiations with both the DP&I and OEH as to the blo-banking mechanism. UCML wrote to the department on 30 April 2013 formally requesting a variation to approval conditions 2 and 4 to further extend the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements to 31 December 2013. <u>Attachment H.</u>
- On 22 May 2013 you approved variations to conditions 2 and 4 to further extend the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements to 31 December 2013.
 <u>Attachment 1</u>
- On 3 December 2013, DP&I wrote to Glencore Coal Assets Australia (GCAA Glencore being a subsidiary of XCN) in response to GCAA's request to extend further, the timing of several approval conditions relating the biodiversity offset areas for a number of Glencore's NSW mining operations. DP&I advised GCAA of extensions in this regard until 30 June 2014. <u>Attachment J.</u>
- Following the above, on 6 December 2013 the department received a formal request from UCML to vary approval conditions 2 and 4 for the third time on the basis of extended delay in establishing the bio-banking mechanism with the NSW Government. <u>Attachment K</u>.
- On 13 December 2013 AMN provided UCML with a copy of the draft variation notice for their consideration. UCML replied the same day, noting their agreement to the proposed wording of the variation notice. <u>Attachment L</u>
- AMN officers have considered the proposed variations and are satisfied that an extension to the timeframe is necessary to ensure alignment of both Comonwealth and State approval conditions. AMN therefore recommends that you please approve the variations to Conditions 2 and 4 of the EPBC approval at <u>Attachment A</u> and the letter to UCML advising of your decision at <u>Attachment B</u>. Your approval will not result in a lesser protection of the protected matters and will provide regulatory efficiency by aligning state and commonwealth reporting requirements.

As per our previous correspondence of 15 February 2013, minor changes to the boundaries of the Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML) Bobadeen Vegetation Offset Area were required to allow for infrastructure associated with the Ulan West dewatering station at Longwall 1.

In accordance with Condition 3 of EPBC Approval No2009/5252 and your correspondence dated 26 March 2013, please find enclosed a copy of the revised Biodiversity Management Plan (BMP) and associated Offset Management Plan (OMP) for the Minister's consideration. For your convenience, updates to the BMP and OMP have been made in blue text.

Furthermore, discussions held with the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities (SEWPaC), the NSW Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DP&I) and the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) on 20 December 2012 resulted in development of an action plan which would see the parties working jointly develop government policy on security of biodiversity offsets areas during 2013.

UCML's parent company Xstrata Coal NSW (XCN), attended the meeting with SEWPaC, DP&I and OEH to ascertain the NSW government's preferred process for providing for conservation of offset areas in perpetuity. The proposal to enter into a Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) under the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974 (NSW) (NPW Act) for the relevant XCN operations which are required to implement biodiversity conservation arrangements, including UCML, was not endorsed by OEH, who proposed instead, payments into the Biobanking Trust fund for each offset area.

UCML remains strongly committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable, when an appropriate mechanism and the content of such a mechanism is approved by NSW and Commonwealth Departments.

In consideration of the above, UCML seeks a variation of the conditions to approval EPBC 2009/5252 which has the effect of extending the timeframe for implementation of the conservation arrangements. In correspondence dated 15 March 2013, DP&I advised that the Director-General granted an extension to 31 December 2013 for the securing of offset areas required under Project Approval 08_0184.

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UCML consider the extension granted by DP&I acceptable and requests the conditions of EPBC 2009/5252 be amended to align with the extension granted by DP&I.

Accordingly, we now seek a further extension from the Department of Environment for conditions 2 and 4 of the approval until the issue of long term security of offset areas is resolved by the relevant NSW Departments.

- 1. The Minister has delegated you as decision maker for this matter under section 515 of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999.
- On 30 November 2010, a delegate of the Minister approved the extension of an open cut coal mine, development of Ulan West underground mine and modification or construction of new infrastructure associated with these operations at Ulan, NSW (<u>Attachment C</u>).
- 3 Condition 2 of the approval for this project requires the person to whom the approval is granted. Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML), to register a legally binding conservation covenant in perpetuity over the Bobadeen and Bobadeen East Offset Areas, as described in Appendix 1 of the approval. This is to offset impacts on the listed White Box Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands threatened ecological community, and foraging habitat of the listed Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large eared Pied Bat.
- 4. Additionally, condition 4 of the approval requires UCML to provide a legally binding conservation mechanism for the long term protection of the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area as described in Appendix 1 of the approval. Under the conditions the conservation mechanism must be agreed to in writing by the Department and finalised within 2 years of the date of the approval. These conservation areas are required to offset the impacts on the Large eared Pied Bat.

- 5 Conditions 2 and 4 of EPBC Approval 2009/5252 have been varied on three previous occasions. The latest variation, approved on 6 January 2014, was required to provide alignment of timing between Commonwealth and State approval conditions and granted an extension to implement the conservation arrangements to 30 June 2014. The brief, which provides further background information, is provided at Attachment D
- 6. On 17 June 2014, UCML wrote to the Department seeking a further timeframe extension to secure their offset sites to 30 June 2015 (<u>Attachment E</u>). The reason for the delay is that the conservation mechanism has not yet been approved by state agencies. This correspondence also noted that UCML remains committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable after a mechanism is approved by Commonwealth and State departments.
- 7. The NSW Department of Planning and Environment has agreed to UCML's variation request to extend the timeframe to secure their offset sites to 30 June 2015. The revised timeframe was granted to allow both finalisation of the NSW Biodiversity Offset Policy and then to allow UCML to make the necessary arrangements to provide appropriate long term security for older offsets under the new policy.
- 8 The Department has considered the proposed variations and is satisfied that an extension to timeframes is necessary to align timing of Commonwealth and State offset deadlines. A proposed condition variation prepared by the Department was agreed to by UCML on 2 July 2014 (Attachment F)
- 9 Bobadeen and Bobadeen East Offset Areas. In support of the proposed timeframe extension for securing an offset area, UCML is implementing the Biodiversity Management Plan, for the already purchased Bobadeen and Bobadeen East offset areas. The plan was approved by the Department on 22 March 2012. Regeneration activities, as defined in the Biodiversity Management Plan have commenced and this includes, but is not limited to, seed collection, propagation of tube stock and revegetation; boundary fencing and signage of the offset area; erosion management, and weed and feral animal control.
- Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area. In addition, UCML is also liaising with landholders to purchase further offset sites in the Brokenback conservation area.
- 11 Although UCML is currently non-compliant with conditions 2 and 4 of EPBC Approval 2009/5252, the request to extend the timeframe was made prior to the deadline. The Compliance Section has been notified of UCML's non-compliance. The Compliance Section considers that no contravention or compliance action should be taken on this matter (Attachment G).
- 12. The Act provides for the variation, revocation or addition to existing approvals where certain conditions are met in accordance with section 143. Subsection 143(1)(c) provides that the Minister (or delegate) may add to any conditions attached to an approval if.
 - a. the approval holder agrees to the addition, and
 - b. the Minister is satisfied that the conditions attached to an approval after the proposed addition, are necessary or convenient for protecting a matter of national environmental significance or repairing or mitigating damage to a such a matter.

I note that the reason for the delay relates to the conservation mechanism not yet being agreed with state agencies. Ulan Coal Mines Limited was granted a variation for an extension of time to meet conditions 2 and 4 of EPBC 2009/5252, granted 30 November 2010, on 24 December 2012, 22 May 2013 and 6 January 2014. Regrettably, the resolution of the conservation offset mechanism is not yet agreed with the NSW agencies. A letter from the Department of Planning and Environment approving a further extension of time to 30 June 2015 and explaining the position of the agencies with respect to the development of a NSW Biodiversity Offset Policy is attached.

Glencore continues to participate where appropriate to support the development of the policy with the NSW Departments. UCML remains strongly committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable after an appropriate mechanism (and the content of such a mechanism) is approved by NSW and Commonwealth Departments. The delay to implementation of a security mechanism has not delayed the practical implementation of the Biodiversity offsets and the areas are protected and managed in accordance with the approval.

Accordingly, we now seek a further extension from the Department of Environment for conditions 2 and 4 of EPBC 2009/5252 to amend the date for completion of the condition to 30 June 2015. Further, with respect to condition 4, the reason for the delay being agreement of the mechanism, not suitability or access to identified offset areas, UCML seeks your confirmation that an alternative offset will not be necessary, although the extended timeframe will be later than four years since the date of the approval. I am writing concerning your request to vary EPBC 2009/5252 Approval conditions 2 and 4 to provide a timeframe extension to secure offset sites from 30 June 2014 to 30 June 2015. I note that the reason for the delay relates to the conservation mechanism not yet being agreed with state agencies, not suitability or access to the identified offset areas. In addition, I note that Ulan Coal Mines Limited remains committed to registering all required offset covenants as soon as practicable after a mechanism is approved by Commonwealth and State departments.

The Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) provides for the variation, revocation or addition to existing approvals where certain conditions are met in accordance with section 143. Subsection 143(1)(c) provides that the Minister (or delegate) may add to any conditions attached to an approval if:

- a) the approval holder agrees to the addition; and
- b) the Minister is satisfied that the conditions attached to an approval after the proposed addition, are necessary or convenient for protecting a matter of national environmental significance or repairing or mitigating damage to a such a matter.

The Department is proposing to brief the delegate in relation to this matter, recommending that EPBC 2009/5252 Approval conditions 2 and 4 be varied as follows (and in the attached document) in accordance with subsection 143(1)(c). The proposed variation is:

This variation would mean the implementation date for the conservation arrangements would be extended by 12 months, from 30 June 2014 to 30 June 2015.

Officers of this Department have considered your request and are satisfied that the proposed variations to conditions 2 and 4 are necessary and convenient for the protection of the matters of national environmental significance. On this basis, as a delegate of the Minister for the Environment and Energy, I have decided to approve your request in accordance with the provisions of the national environment law, the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act). Conditions 2 and 4 must now be undertaken in accordance with the varied conditions specified in the variation notification, which has been attached for your information.

Re: Ulan Coal Security of Biodiversity Offset Areas

I refer to our most recent correspondence to the Department of Environment (DoE) dated 20 April 2015 regarding the long term conservation of biodiversity offset areas for Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML).

As outlined in our previous written correspondence on this matter, in accordance with conditions 2 and 4 of EPBC Approval EPBC 2009/5252, we are required to make suitable arrangements to provide for the long term security of the Bobadeen and Brokenback offset areas to the satisfaction of the DoE.

On 9 July 2015, UCML received a letter from DoE granting an extension until 30 April 2016 to secure the offset areas. Separate approval granting an extension until 31 December 2016 was provided by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE).

Conscious of the need to finalise security mechanisms to satisfy State and Commonwealth conditions of approval, UCML has consistently and repeatedly (over a period spanning 2011 to 2015) sought guidance and assistance from the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) regarding the form of security that would be considered acceptable by the NSW Government.

A summary of these discussions (including written correspondence and face to face meetings) is provided below:

- Initial meeting with DPE in September 2011;
- Joint meeting with DPE, OEH and DoE in December 2012;
- Separate meeting with DPE in August 2013;
- Joint meeting with DPE, OEH, NSW Minerals Council and its member companies in June 2014;
- Separate meetings with OEH in March and August 2015;
- Letters to the NSW DPE in October 2011, February 2012, July 2012, December 2012, October 2013, June 2014 and April 2015; and
- Provision of specific information to OEH on Glencore Coal Assets Australia (including UCML) offset areas in April and August 2015.

In December 2015, UCML received correspondence from OEH summarising the required mechanism to secure its existing offset areas and seeking to meet to discuss a program of works. UCML will be looking to meet with OEH in early 2016 to obtain further specific details on process to enable security arrangements to be put in place as soon as practicable.

The process for securing offset areas under the OEH Voluntary Conservation Agreement (VCA) process is as follows:

- 1. Assessment
 - Desktop assessment of conservation value
 - Site visit
 - Confirmation of tenure
- 2. Option agreed by landholder & OEH
 - Most suitable option for conservation is agreed upon
- 3. Negotiation & preparation of documents
 - Conservation Area is identified
 - Agreement is prepared
- 4. Signatures & Registration
 - Agreement is signed & registered on land title

Based on previous VCA processes undertaken by UCML, it is likely to take approximately 18 months to complete. Accordingly, we propose the following amendment to conditions 2 and 4 of EPBC Approval EPBC 2009/5252 as follows:

- 2. To offset impacts on the listed White Box Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands threatened ecological community, and foraging habitat of the listed Swift Parrot. Regent Honeyeater and Large-eared Pied Bat, the person taking the action must register a legally binding conservation covenant in perpetuity over Bobadeen Offset Area and Bobadeen East Offset Area as described in Appendix 1. The covenants must be registered by no later than 30 June 2017 and covenant conditions must ensure that management is for the protection and enhancement of the matters of national environmental significance identified above.
- 4. To offset the impacts on Large-eared Pied Bat, the person taking the action must provide a legally binding conservation mechanism for the long term protection of the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area as described in Appendix 1. The conservation mechanism must be agreed to in writing by the Department and must be finalised by no later than 30 June 2017

If the conservation mechanism cannot be finalised by 30 June 2017, the proponent must submit for the Minister's approval an alternative offset within 3 years of the date of this approval. The alternative offset must provide at least an equivalent environmental outcome to those specified under condition 5.

The requested extension will allow the proper process to be mandated by the NSW Government and negate further variations of approval conditions or the timeframe by which offsets are required to be secured. It is a legal requirement through our NSW and EPBC approval conditions and associated management plans to manage and protect existing offset areas. Therefore, whether a formal legal agreement requiring protection of the offsets is currently registered on title does not change the site's commitment to management of the offset areas.

As outlined in our previous correspondence on this matter, we would like to reinforce our strong desire to put in place conservation mechanisms for existing UCML biodiversity offsets as soon as practicable given the prolonged nature of discussions with NSW and Commonwealth Governments on this matter. We will continue to engage with all departments so that security arrangements can be put in place as soon as practicable.

Glencore Coal Assets Australia - Extension to Security of Offset Areas

I refer to your letter dated 26 November 2015, seeking a further extension of time to make suitable arrangements for the long term security for biodiversity offset areas required for the s22 Ulan and s22

While I appreciate that Glencore has sought previous extensions of time to ensure that its offset areas are secured under appropriate mechanisms that align with NSW Government policies, I must note that Glencore has had a significant period of time to resolve these matters. In particular, I note:

- the NSW Government has clearly identified biobanking agreements as its preferred mechanism for securing biodiversity offset areas since the release of the NSW Biodiversity Policy for Major Projects on 1 October 2014;
- where biobanking agreements cannot be achieved, the NSW Biodiversity Policy for Major Projects provides a range of criteria for establishing suitable offset mechanisms;
- OEH wrote to the NSW Minerals Council in December 2014, detailing several transitional options for the long term protection of existing, unsecured offset sites; and
- Glencore and OEH have been engaged in direct negotiations over the past few years to identify
 appropriate mechanisms for each of Glencore's offset sites.

I also understand that in a letter to Glencore dated 1 December 2015, OEH has provided a detailed description of the NSW Government's policy position on securing offsets and confirmed a range of specific conservation measures (including biobanking and conservation agreements) that it would consider establishing for the biodiversity offset areas required under Glencore's existing approvals.

Given the NSW Government's policy position on this matter has been established for at least 12 months, the Department is of the view that a final 12 month extension should provide sufficient time for Glencore to finalise any outstanding arrangements and provide for the long term security for its offset areas.

Accordingly, the Secretary has granted an extension to the relevant completion dates until 31 December 2016, for Glencore to reach agreement with OEH and formalise its outstanding conservation obligations.

The Department advises that it will be reluctant to grant any further extension unless Glencore can provide sufficient and convincing evidence that it has undertaken every reasonable effort to formalise appropriate security mechanisms with OEH.

I write to you regarding EPBC 2009/5252 conditions 2 and 4. Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML) is required under these conditions to register a legally binding conservation mechanism over the Bobadeen Offset Area, Bobadeen East Offset Area, Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area by no later than 30 April 2016.

On 11 February 2016 UCML lodged a request with Department of Environment (DoE) to make a variation to approval conditions 2 and 4 to allow until 30 June 2017 to secure offset sites.

DoE provided a response via email on 3 May 2016 and requested UCML provide a schedule of the specific actions being undertaken to achieve key milestones to evidence progression towards the final goal of securing formal conservation agreements by 31 December 2016.

In response to your request for a schedule of the specific actions being undertaken, the Table included in Attachment 1 details actions towards formal conservation agreements.

Glencore representatives Mr David O'Brien and Mr Nigel Charnock met with Mr Shane Gaddes and Mr **\$22** from the Department of Environment (DoE) in Canberra on 29 February 2016. At the meeting, Glencore and the DoE discussed the issue of long term security of existing Glencore biodiversity offset areas (including UCML) at some length. As an outcome of that meeting Glencore understood that the DoE were providing UCML with the option to accept a similar EPBC condition to the variation recently granted for Glencore's **\$22** This condition requires **\$22** to finalise offset security arrangements by 30 June 2017 or by another date agreed in writing with the Minister. Following the meeting on 29 February, Mr O'Brien sent an email to **\$22** on 4 March 2016 confirming that UCML would accept the Department's proposal as part of the proposed variation to EPBC 2009/5252.

As shown by the attached Schedule, Glencore are working towards submission of the signed Conservation Agreement for the Bobadeen Offset Area, Bobadeen East Offset Area, Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area to the NSW Government by mid-December 2016.

Landholder approval will also be required for the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area which are partially located on land administered by Crown Lands, with the Brokenback Conservation Area also having a small portion of privately held land. Consultation is underway to secure approval of the Conservation Agreements from these parties before submission OEH.

Key Points:

- On 30 November 2010, a delegate of the Minister approved with conditions the Ulan Coal Continued Operations Project, Ulan, NSW (at <u>Attachment C</u>), which includes the extension of the open cut mine, development of the underground mine and to modify or construct new infrastructure associated with these operations.
- 2 The approval conditions have been varied on 24 December 2012, 22 May 2013, 6 January 2014, 23 July 2014, 7 July 2015 and 11 November 2016. <u>Conditions 2 and 4</u> have been varied on five occasions.
- 3 Condition 2 of the approval requires the approval holder to offset impacts to the EPBC Act listed White Box-Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands (Box Gum Woodland) and foraging habitat for the Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large-eared Pied Bat by registering, by 30 June 2017, conservation covenants over the Bobadeen Offset Area and Bobadeen East Vegetation Offset Area.

4 Condition 4 of the approval requires the approval holder to offset impacts to the EPBC Act listed Large-eared Pied Bat by providing a legally binding conservation mechanism for the long term protection of the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area. The conservation mechanism must be agreed in writing by the Department and finalised by 30 June 2017.

Variation to Conditions 2 and 4

- 5 On 19 June 2017 the approval holder, Ulan Coal Mines Limited (Ulan), requested an extension to the timeframe to meet the requirements of Condition 2 and 4, and for Condition 2 to be consistent with state conditions requiring only evidence of application for a Voluntary Conservation Agreement to the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) (Attachment D)
 - Delays to secured the offset properties are due to negotiating the content of the conservation covenants/agreements with landowners, and the number of conservation agreement applications with NSW OEH. Ulan, for example, are currently negotiating 27 conservation agreements with NSW OEH.
 - The Department advised Ulan that evidence of an application would not meet the approval conditions.
- Condition 4 specifies that if the conservation mechanism cannot be finalised by 30 June 2017, the proponent must submit for the Minister's approval an alternative offset within 3 years of the date of this approval (ie within 3 years from 30 June 2017)
 - Given the need for an alternative site has not been triggered since the original approval, and that there is progress towards a legally binding mechanism for the Brokenback Conservation and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Areas, the Department recommends that these offset sites should be secured by 31 August 2018. If the offset sites cannot be secured by this date, the requirement for an alternative offset site will be triggered under condition 4.
- 7 To evaluate the 2016 variation request, the Post Approval Sections requested a schedule of actions to secure the offset properties (see <u>Attachment E</u>) Significant progress has been made since late 2016, including finalising field surveys of biodiversity offset areas, and land owner consultation on draft agreements
- DPE has granted Ulan an extension to 28 February 2018 to secure the offsets, and advised that they would be reticent to approving further time extensions. DPE provided the timetable of conservation agreements being assessed by NSW OEH and encouraged Ulan to respond promptly to OEH comments (see <u>Attachment F</u>).
- 9 OEH has advised the Department it is satisfied with progress and commitments from Ulan, however tenure issues related to the Bobadeen East Vegetation Offset Area (BEVOA) must be resolved before the conservation agreements can be finalised

Revised Bobadeen East Vegetation Offset Area

10 On 9 May 2016, the proponent for the s22

s22 Informed the Post Approvals Section of negotiations with neighbouring landowners to construct a power transmission line traversing the BEVOA. The BEVOA adjoins the windfarm, with the transmission line impacting a portion of the vegetation on BEVOA's eastern boundary.

- This matter was initially referred to the NSW North Assessments section as the project is being assessed under a bilateral assessment. The Department advised that \$22 should offset the impact or negotiate alternative offsets with Ulan Correspondence between Post Approvals and Assessments is at Attachment G
- 11 The transmission line will directly impact 13 13 ha of vegetation within the BEVOA. A further 4 97 ha will be fragmented by the transmission line S22 propose an 18 18ha replacement site that borders the western boundary of the BEVOA. <u>Attachment H</u> shows the original and revised BEVOA. The BEVOA will not be fragmented as a result of the revised boundary.

- 12. The proposed transmission line has created further delays resulting in Ulan submitting a revised conservation agreement to address boundary and demarcation issues.
 - Based on its experience with delays to similar offset securing processes, the Department considers the period to finalising the offset arrangments under conditons 2 and 4 of the approval should be extended to 31 August 2018
- 13. The Department recieved further information from Ulan, NSW DPE and NSW OEH that indicates the proposed alterations will not result in a reduced offset area, or reduced quality of Box Gum Woodland, and that the requirements of approval conditions 2 and 4 will be met (see <u>Attachment 1</u>). This includes.
 - NSW OEH advised it is satisfied that the revised BEVOA meets state consent condition requirements; and
 - under the NSW DPE approval, the revised BEVOA is of sufficient size and quality to meet the NSW biodiversity offset obligations.
- Given the above, the Department requested Ulan provide a summary of the final offset arrangements with s22 - see request and response at <u>Attachment J</u>.
- The Department considers the alterations to BEVOA will provide the same level of protection to matters of national environmental significance.
- In accordance with Section 143(1) of the EPBC Act, the conditions as varied are necessary and convenient because.
 - the revised BEVOA will provide the same level of protection to matters of national environmental significance.
 - the replacement area provides contiguous landscape, and does not fragment the offset area; and
 - the requirements of approval Conditions 2 and 4 otherwise remain, and provide a suitable timeframe for securing the offsets.

Recommendations

- 17. Ulan is currently non-compliant with conditions 2 and 4 of EPBC Approval 2009/5252, however, the request to extend the timeframe was made prior to 30 June 2017. The proposed variation allows Ulan to be compliant with their approval. The Department's Environmental Audit Section has been notified of the potential non-compliance, and the Department's Compliance Section considers that no contravention or compliance action should be taken on this matter.
- Ulan agreed to the proposed variation, including a revised date of 31 August 2018 to secure the offset areas (<u>Attachment K</u>).
- 19. The Department recommends that you:
 - note the revised Bobadeen East Vegetation Offset Area (Attachment H);
 - agree to (a) to trigger the requirement of alternative offsets if the conservation agreements are not finalised by 31 August 2018, as specified in Conditon 4, and (b) extend from 30 June 2017 to 31 August 2018 the period to secure the offset properties specified in conditions 2 and 4.
 - sign the Variation to Conditions Attached to Approval notice (Attachment A); and
 - > sign the letter to advising Ulan of your decision (Attachment B).
- 20. The proposed variation has been processed in accordance with the approval monitoring standard operating procedures 1.1 Variation of approval conditions.



Re: Ulan Coal Security of Biodiversity Offset Areas

I refer to your most recent letter dated 11 November 2016 approving a variation for an extension of time to secure the long term conservation of existing (approved) biodiversity offset areas for Ulan Coal Mines Limited under EPBC2009/5252. The table provided in **Attachment 1**, outlines the status of Conservation Agreements (CA's) for Ulan Coal Mines Limited. Whilst some unforeseen delays have been experienced in order to address feedback received from NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) relating to CA content, plans and survey requirements, GCAA has made substantial progress towards completion. Draft CA's Ulan have been submitted to OEH for review. There are a number of outstanding matters relating to the Ulan CA's that we are working to finalise as soon as practicable.

OEH's Conservation Department has advised GCAA that they currently have a large number of CA's to review and process, in addition to the 27 draft CA's relating to GCAA sites. At this stage OEH have not provided Glencore with a firm timeframe for them to complete their review of the draft CA's for GCAA sites. However, the overall large number of CA's for them to process suggests that this may take some time.

Given the uncertainty regarding the time that it will take OEH to complete their review, we have sought an extension from NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) that requires relevant GCAA operations, including Ulan Mine, to provide appropriate long term security for existing offset areas *within 6 months of the NSW Government (OEH) providing written confirmation to the approval holder that the Conservation Agreement submitted for their approval meets Government's requirements.* The proposed extension would provide both OEH and GCAA sufficient time after CA's for each GCAA operation are approved by OEH to obtain the required signatures on the CA's (including Joint Venture parties and Crown Lands in the case of Ulan Mine) and have the CA's registered on the relevant land titles.

Glencore Coal Assets Australia Extension to Security of Offset Areas

I refer to your letter dated 7 June 2017 seeking an extension of time to make suitable arrangements for the long-term security for Conservation and Biodiversity Stewardship Agreements for Glencore Coal's assets in NSW.

The Department has liaised with Glencore and the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) to draft a forecast timetable for review of the agreements. This timetable has been developed on the understanding that OEH has received draft versions of relevant agreements and has indicated that each agreement requires around three months to review and provide comments to Glencore.

I have attached the forecast timetable for OEH's review of these agreements and encourage Glencore to respond to OEH's review comments in a timely manner. I also note that:

- Ulan's three Bobadeen Offset Areas are covered under one agreement, the area of which is subject to review due to a power easement associated with the Liverpool Range Windfarm development;
- four of thes22 agreements are not due for submission until 2018; and
- consent has not yet been obtained from the private landholder at Brokenback.

While the Department understands the challenges faced in developing and implementing the agreements, it is becoming concerned with the prolonged delays in implementation and will be reticent to approve any further extensions to the security timeframes unless thoroughly justified. It is therefore imperative that the agreements are finalised and implemented as soon as possible.

Given the above and the need for a suitable response period to resolve any issues raised in OEH's review of the draft agreements, the Secretary has granted an extension to 28 February 2018 for the finalisation of the attached agreements. The only exceptions to this revised date are the s22 Offsets

agreements, which are due by 30 June 2018.

Background

- The Minister has delegated you as decision maker for this matter pursuant to section 515 of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act).
- On 30 November 2010, a delegate of the Minister approved with conditions a proposal to extend the open cut coal mine, develop Ulan West underground mine and modify or construct new infrastructure associated with these operations and the Ulan No 3 underground operation. The project includes clearing up to 69 ha of vegetation (<u>Attachment C</u>). Conditions 2 and 4 have been varied on six occasions.
- On 23 August 2018 the approval holder, Ulan Coal Mines Ltd (UCML), requested variations to conditions 2 and 4 of the approval to extend the timeframe to secure offsets to 31 December 2018 (<u>Attachment D</u>). Your agreement to the proposed variation, which is agreed by UCML, will provide an additional four months to secure the offset area under a legal mechanism.

The proposed variation

4. The controlling provisions for the action are listed threatened species and communities (Sections 18 & 18A) and listed migratory species (sections 20 & 20A). The conditions of approval provide for the protection of White Box – Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands ecological community, habitat for the Swift Parrot, Regent Honeyeater and Large-eared Pied Bat.

- Conditions 2 and 4 of the approval require UCLM to register, by 31 August 2018, legally binding conservation covenants over the offset areas identified in Appendix 1 of <u>Attachment C</u>.
 - Condition 2 specifies the Bobadeen and Bobadeen East Offset Areas for offsetting of impacts on the ecological community and species habitat.
 - Condition 4 specifies the Brokenback Conservation Area and Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area for offsetting of impacts on the Large-eared Pied Bat. This condition also requires an alternative offset to be submitted for the Ministers approval within 3 years of the date of the previous variation approval (if the covenants cannot be finalised by 31 August 2020.
- UCLM advised that conservation agreements for the Bobadeen and Bobadeen East offset sites required by <u>condition 2</u> were submitted to the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) on 29 June 2018 and are awaiting OEH advice on execution of these agreements (<u>Attachment E</u>).
- The offset sites required by <u>condition 4</u> include crown and privately owned portions, and UCLM have advised (<u>Attachment E</u>) of the following difficulties in securing the offsets.
 - UCLM submitted final draft conservation agreements to the NSW Department of Industry Crown Lands and Water Division (Crown Lands). Crown Lands have provided a preliminary letter of support (<u>Attachment F</u>) that the draft agreements indicate a potential benefit to the Crown estate. The letter also indicates that Crown Land will work with UCLM to determine if the agreements can be authorised and approved by the Industry Minister.
 - UCLM advised that the landowner and the NSW Department of Planning and the Environment (DPE) are unable to agree on an appropriate conservation agreement for the privately owned portion of the Brokenback Conservation Area and may need to seek an alternative offset.

Proposed decision

- An extension of time to secure offsets would provide for OEH to consider the final draft conservation agreements for the Bobadeen and Bobadeen East offset areas required by <u>condition 2</u>. It would also provide for:
 - Crown Lands' decision on the draft conservation agreements that would enable OEH's consideration of the Spring Gully and crown portion of the Brokenback offsets required by condition 4.
 - A decision to proceed with the privately owned portion of the Brokenback offset required by condition 4.

Further clarity around the condition 4 offsets would support a future decision around whether the alternative offset requirement is triggered for condition 4. Note that the Department has also proposed to vary condition 4 to clarify the date upon which an alternative offset must be submitted to the Minister for approval.

- 9. On 2 October 2018, UCLM agreed to the draft variation (see Attachment G).
- 10. The Department considers the conditions attached to the approval after the proposed variation are, in accordance with section 143(1)(c) of the EPBC Act, necessary or convenient for protecting the relevant matters protected. This is because the conditions as varied will continue to ensure a suitable offset area is managed and protected to compensate for the residual impacts on protected matters.
- 11. On the above basis, the Department recommends that you:
 - agree to vary the conditions of approval for EPBC 2009/5252, in accordance with the variation decision instrument at <u>Attachment A</u>;
 - > sign the decision instrument at Attachment A; and
 - sign the letter to UCLM at <u>Attachment B</u> advising of your decision.

I refer to Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML) approval EPBC2009/5252 and the subsequent variation to approval EPBC2009/5252 issued by the Department of Environment and Energy (DoEE) on 16 February 2018.

UCML have been working with relevant stakeholders to secure Voluntary Conservation Agreements (VCA's) for offsets required under UCML's project approvals EPBC2009/5252 and PA08_0184 (issued by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment).

The status of the offsets is as follows:

- VCA's for the Bobadeen Conservation Area, the Highetts Road Conservation Area and the UCML portion of the Brokenback Conservation Area were submitted to the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) in final form on 29 June 2018;



- Ultimately the work done to date by Ulan Coal and the proposed further study and monitoring work over the duration of the Agreements will have the potential to benefit the Crown estate and the people of NSW through the development of a comprehensive environmental and heritage resource base.

It is for the reasons outlined above that the Department can provide preliminary support for the request from Ulan Coal and a commitment to work with Ulan Coal over the coming months to determine if the Conservation Agreements can be authorised and approved by the Minister over the Crown land.

The progression of any Conservation Agreement is subject to agreement to the following in principle negotiation terms, agreement to the terms of the Conservation Agreements and ultimately approval by the Minister administering the NP&WA and NSW Department of Planning and Environment.

- that it wishes to proceed with the negotiation of the Conservation Agreements over Crown land; and
- · completion of consultation with all stakeholders.

The Department will consider alternative mechanisms to secure Offset Areas, to that of the proposed Conservation Agreements, such as Public Positive Covenants or Restrictions on Land Use under the *Conveyancing Act 1919*.

Attachment A: - Draft Termination Clauses

Native title restrictions on the grant of this Agreement

- 1.1 This Agreement does not permit or authorise any of the following:
 - (i) the excavation or clearing of any of the Land¹ except for:
 - excavation or clearing that is reasonably necessary for the protection of public health or public safety; or
 - b. tree lopping, clearing of noxious or introduced animal or plant species, foreshore reclamation, regeneration or environmental assessment or protection activities;
 - (ii) mining (other than fossicking by using hand-held implements);
 - the construction or placing on the Land, of any building, structure, or other thing (other than fencing or a gate), that is a fixture;
 - (iv) the disposal or storing, on the Land, of any garbage or any poisonous, toxic or hazardous substance;
 - (v) the conferral of a right of exclusive possession over any of the land or waters; or
 - (vi) the grant of a lease over the Land.

Termination of this Agreement upon approved determination of native title

1.2 This Agreement terminates immediately on the making of an approved determination under the *Native Title Act 1993 (Commonwealth) ("NT Act")* that native title exists in relation to the Agreement area, in part or in whole, without any further notice or action.

Indigenous Land Use Agreement - New Agreement

- 1.3 The parties agree that, if, prior to an approved determination under the NT Act that native title exists over the Land (in part or in whole):
 - (a) an indigenous land use agreement ("ILUA") is registered on the Register of Indigenous Land Use Agreements and the area of land described in the ILUA includes the whole or the part of the Land, and
 - (b) the ILUA expressly provides that the parties to the ILUA agree to enter into a new agreement on the same or similar terms and conditions as this Agreement('the New Agreement"),

then the New Agreement is valid and binding and will take effect on the same terms and conditions as this Agreement, without the need for the parties to enter into any further documentation or take any other action, except that:

 the commencement date of the New Agreement will be the date the ILUA is registered on the Register of Indigenous Land Use Agreements;

¹¹ The definition of "Land" can be amended to include any waters within the Land.

- (ii) (if applicable) the New Agreement only applies to that part of the Land affected by the ILUA;
- (iii) clauses 1.2, 1.3, 1.4 and 1.5 of this special condition do not apply to the New Agreement; and
- (iv) the Minister will register with the Registrar General a variation or such other document as is required to give effect to this clause 1.3 and to ensure that the New Agreement is binding on the Land.

1.5 Words and terms used in this clause and defined in the NT Act have the same meaning.

2. Agreement subject to Aboriginal land claim

2.1 This Agreement is subject to an aboriginal land claim over all or part of this Land pursuant to s. 36 of the *Aboriginal Land Rights Act* 1983 ("ALR Act").

2.2 Notwithstanding any other provision, this Agreement will end, in part or in whole, in the event that the Minister administering the *ALR Act* grants the aboriginal land claim over the Land, or part of it, or a Court orders that the Land or part of it, be transferred to the claimant aboriginal land council

2.3 The parties acknowledge and agree that no party is entitled to any compensation costs or damages in respect of the termination of this Agreement by operation of this clause.

Thank you for providing a copy of the draft revised conditions for EPBC 2009/5252 and for the opportunity to comment.

Ulan Coal Mines Ltd (UCML) are generally happy with the proposed amendments to conditions 1. and 4. as set out in the attached draft, with the exception of the second paragraph attached to draft condition 4. UCML requests that this be amended to state:

If the conservation mechanism cannot be finalised by 31 December 2018, the proponent must submit for the Minister's approval an alternate offset by 31 December 2021 within 3 years of the variation approved on 31 August 2018. The alternate offset must provide at least an equivalent environmental outcome to those specified under condition 5.

UCML consider that the proposed preferred amendment does not vary the intent of the condition or considerably vary the timeframes associated with this condition.

If the Department is not amenable to this preferred amendment, UCML's second preference would be that the condition be amended to state:

If the conservation mechanism cannot be finalised by 31 December 2018, the proponent must submit for the Minister's approval an alternate offset within 3 years of the date of this approval within 3 years of the variation approved on 31 August 2018. The alternate offset must provide at least an equivalent environmental outcome to those specified under condition 5.

This condition would be consistent with the wording of previously approved amendments and also would not vary the intent of the condition or considerably vary the timeframes associated with this condition.

Notwithstanding the comments above, UCML remain committed to finalising the current Conservation Agreements ASAP and by 31 December 2018, pending agreement with all associated Government Agencies.

Re: Ulan Coal Security of Biodiversity Offset Areas

I refer to the Department of Environment and Energy's (DoEE) letter dated 4 October 2018 granting an extension to the timeframe to make suitable arrangements for the long-term security of biodiversity offsets as required by Approval EPBC2009/5252 for the Ulan Coal Mine.

Ulan Coal Mine Ltd (UCML) have continued to work with relevant stakeholders and primarily the Department of Industry Crown Lands and Water Division (Crown Lands) to secure Conservation Agreements (CA's) for offsets required under UCML's project approvals PA08_0184 (issued by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment) and EPBC2009/5252.

Whilst significant progress has been made towards finalising the CA's, the status of the offsets is as follows:

- CA's for the Bobadeen Conservation Area, the Highetts Road Conservation Area and the UCML portion of the Brokenback Conservation Area were submitted to the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) in final form on 29 June 2018. OEH advised UCML on 7 December 2018 that they are in the process of finalising the CA's for Ulan's agreement;
- The owner of the section of the Brokenback Conservation Area that is privately owned has not agreed to a CA and UCML requested approval of the DP&E to proceed with a Conservation Covenant on 11 April 2018. UCML have continued to liaise with the property owner in an attempt to finalise a mutually acceptable agreement however, this has not yet been achieved;
- Final versions of the CA's for the Spring Gully and the Crown owned portion of the Brokenback Conservation Area were provided to Crown Lands for review on 28 June 2018. Crown Lands subsequently provided a draft licence for UCML's consideration;
- During a meeting with Crown Lands on 5 September 2018, Crown Lands requested that UCML submit a new Licence Application due to recent amendments to the *Crown Land*

- On 28 September 2018 Crown Lands provided correspondence to UCML providing support for the offsets. This also highlighted benefits in terms of research, improvement of environmental values and benefits to the Crown and people of NSW through the development of a comprehensive environmental and heritage resource base;
- The letter of 28 September 2018 also identified a number of proposed Clauses to be incorporated into the draft Conservation and Compensation Agreements associated with the offset areas;
- UCML have been in regular dialogue with Crown Lands since receiving their letter of 28 September 2018 in an attempt to finalise the Licence and Conservation and Compensation Agreements. UCML provided a revised draft Compensation Agreement to Crown Lands on 27 September 2018 and proposed amendments to the Conservation Agreement on 29 October 2018;
- UCML received response letters from Crown Lands on 13 and 14 December 2018 in relation to the proposed amendments to the Conservation Agreement and the revised draft Compensation Agreement (which Crown Lands advised remains subject to review from Crown Lands Legal Branch);
- UCML are currently considering the amended draft Compensation Agreement. UCML plan on meeting with Crown Lands as soon as practicable to discuss available options to resolving issues surrounding the proposed termination clause within the draft Conservation Agreement and to further discuss the revised draft Compensation Agreement. It is also likely that this will require meetings with OEH in relation to the proposed termination clause.

UCML remain committed to securing the current offsets via seeking a resolution with Crown Lands with respect to the Crown Licence and Conservation and Compensation Agreements. However, given the complexities involved and delays experienced to date this is expected to take some time to resolve.

Due to the current challenges being experienced in finalising the relevant Licences and Agreements with the respective parties, UCML have initiated a study to explore other possible offset options that may be available, in the event that currently sought Agreements cannot be reached.

UCML engaged EcoLogical Australia Pty Ltd to undertake a preliminary vegetation community and cliffline validation field survey within three land parcels currently owned by UCML, which has recently been completed. Whilst the preliminary assessment has provided positive findings in relation to the potential suitability of the land parcels as offsets further detailed assessments are required in relation to Ecology and Cultural Heritage. UCML plan on progressing these assessments in concert with seeking to finalise the Crown licence, Conservation and Compensation agreements and CA's as soon as practicable. UCML would like to meet with DoEE in the New Year to discuss the current challenges being encountered in finalising the Crown licence, Conservation Agreements, Compensation Agreements and CA's and further discuss options moving forward.

Considering the further progress made and challenges encountered in relation to these Agreements UCML respectfully request that DoEE approve an extension of time for finalisation of the respective agreements until 30 June 2019. UCML consider the requested timeframe necessary due to the complexities involved and delays experienced to date in seeking to finalise the relevant Agreements.

I refer to correspondence provided on 11 March 2019 in relation to the current status of long term security arrangements for UCML's approved offset areas as required by Project Approval 08_0184 for the Ulan Coal Mine. This letter provides a further update.

Offsets on UCML owned land

The Conservation Agreement (CA) for the Bobadeen Offset area has now been signed by the registered Lessee and returned to the NSW Biodiversity Conservation Trust (BCT). UCML were advised by the BCT on 20 May 2019 that the CA's for all CA's on Ulan owned land, including for the Brokenback Area 1, Highetts Road and Bobadeen Offset areas have been signed and are progressing through a final check before being sent to the Land Registry Service for registration on title.

Offsets on Crown land

UCML met with Crown Lands on 19 March 2019 and their legal representatives to discuss the draft Crown Licence. The draft Conservation Agreements that are proposed to be registered on Crown land, including potential amendments to the automatic termination rights sought by Crown Lands in relation to a potential Native Title determination and in relation to Aboriginal land claims were also discussed, amongst other related matters.

UCML have been liaising with Crown Lands since the meeting in relation to commitments made by both parties to address matters discussed at the meeting and UCML are currently seeking to meet with Crown Lands, the BCT and the Department of Planning and Environment in the week commencing 27 May 2019 to discuss and attempt to resolve outstanding matters.

Offsets on Private land

UCML wrote to the NSW Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) on 7 March 2019 requesting approval to secure the Brokenback Conservation Area on "Farrs Hill" via a Covenant on Title under the *Conveyancing Act 1919*. The DPE advised UCML on 17 April 2019 that the Secretary does not object to the proposed security mechanism and requested that UCML informs the landowner, the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) and Department of Environment and Energy (DoEE) of the Secretaries decision (DPE's advice is provided in Attachment 1).

Given DPE's concurrence with UCML's proposed mechanism of security, UCML requests the approval of the DoEE to secure this 10ha portion of the Brokenback Conservation Area on 'Farrs Hill" via a restrictive covenant registered on the land title pursuant to the *Conveyancing Act* 1919 (the Covenant).

UCML firmly believes that the conservation objectives for this offset area and long term security can be achieved using this mechanism and that this complies with the requirements of condition 2 of the EPBC Approval 2009/5252, which requires the placement of a legally binding conservation covenant in perpetuity over the relevant land parcels. Please refer to the letter provided to DPE on 7 March 2019 for UCML's justification for the use of a Covenant (refer Attachment 1).

Potential Alternate Offsets

As noted in recent correspondence, UCML have been progressing the suitability assessments of three potential alternate offset areas located on UCML owned land. The assessments are being undertaken as a contingency in case the currently approved offsets cannot be secured. UCML will continue to progress these assessments in concert with seeking to finalise the Crown licence, and Conservation and Compensation agreements as soon as practicable.

EcoLogical Australia Pty Ltd (ELA) recently completed a vegetation community and cliffline habitat validation field survey within the potential alternate offset areas. Whilst the preliminary assessment has provided positive findings in relation to the potential suitability of the land parcels as offsets, further detailed assessments of the alternate sites are required to confirm the suitability of the alternative areas. This includes detailed vegetation mapping, targeted threatened species surveys, fauna habitat mapping and Cultural Heritage assessment. I have attached the vegetation community and cliffline habitat validation survey report prepared by ELA for your information (refer Attachment 2).

UCML met with OEH on 25 March 2019 to discuss the potential alternate offset areas, available security mechanisms and the methodology for the detailed assessment of the alternate offset areas and have had follow up discussions with OEH. UCML subsequently met with OEH and DPE on 22 May 2019 to discuss and seek a consensus on the methodology for assessment of the alternate offset areas. DPE and OEH requested at the meeting that UCML write to both agencies seeking formal advice on the methodology to be employed. UCML plan on writing to both agencies in the coming days.

UCML looks forward to the Department's response in relation to the requested approval to secure the Brokenback Conservation Area on "Farrs Hill" via a Covenant on Title under the *Conveyancing Act* 1919.

Ulan Coal Mine (08_0184) - Long Term Security of Biodiversity Offset Areas

I refer to your letter dated 7 March 2019 about long-term security mechanisms for the Brokenback Conservation Area, as required under project approval 08_0184 for the Ulan Coal Mine.

The Department understands that the owner of the privately-owned portion of Brokenback Conservation Area does not wish to enter into a Conservation Agreement due to the associated long-term monitoring and reporting obligations. Instead, a positive and restrictive covenant on title is proposed to secure this land under the *Conveyancing Act 1919*.

Further, the Department notes that:

- the privately-owned portion is remotely located, is densely timbered and is unlikely to require active ongoing management; and
- the privately-owned portion has the same vegetation as the adjacent company-owned and Crown Land, reference monitoring points within the adjacent land are proposed to monitor the entire Brokenback Conservation Area for the life of the mine.

Given these circumstances, the Secretary does not object to the proposed security mechanism and proposed monitoring. I would appreciate it if you could inform the landowner, the Office of Environment and Heritage and the Commonwealth Department of Energy and Environment of the Secretary's decision at the earliest convenience.

In regard to the long-term security of the Crown Land portion of the Brokenback Conservation Area, the Department notes that the company has asked Crown Lands to provide further advice on the terms of the proposed Conservation Agreement. The Department would like to meet with you and Crown Lands following receipt of the advice.

I refer to our meeting on 20 February 2019 in relation to the current status of long term security arrangements for Ulan Coal Mines Ltd's (UCML) approved offset areas as required by Project Approval 08_0184 for the Ulan Coal Mine.

Offsets on UCML owned land

As discussed during the meeting, the Conservation Agreements (CA) for the Brokenback Area I and Highetts Road have been finalised, signed and returned to the NSW Biodiversity Conservation Trust (BCT). The CA for the Bobadeen Offset area has been finalised and is in the process of being signed by the registered Lessee before being returned to the NSW BCT.

Offsets on Private land

In relation to the privately owned portion of the Brokenback CA located on "Farts Hill", the landowners **s47F** have indicated that they will not agree to the Offset area being secured using a Conservation Agreement due to requirements associated with on-going monitoring and reporting on the performance of the Offset area after the term of the UCML Approvals. Figure I, in Attachment A depicts the Brokenback CA and associated land ownership.

The portion of the Brokenback CA located on "Farrs Hill" is 10ha in area, is small in size relative to the overall size of the Brokenback CA (which has a total area of 58ha) and very small in size relative to the other UCML offset areas (0.05% of the total UCML offset areas). It is very remote, densely timbered and in good ecologocal condition and therefore requires minimal active management. Access is impracticable over most of the offset area as can be seen in Figure 1.

The CA's drafted for the UCML and Crown owned portions of the Brokenback CA contain the same Plant Community Types (PCT) as are found in the portion located on the privately owned land, but in larger quantities (refer Figure 1, in Attachment A). The UCML and Crown owned portions contain 3 detailed monitoring sites for the red ironbark community (PCT 478), 4 for the narrow leaved ironbark community (PCT 479) and 4 for the Rough-barked Apple- Blakely's Red Gum community (PCT 481). The monitoring sites located within the UCML and Crown owned portions are considered as providing adquate monitoring in terms of the condition of each PCT and the offset area as a whole.

Ulan Coal Mines Ltd ABN \$0.000 189 248 Manager of the Ulan Joint Venture There is approximately 150m of cliffline over the privately owned portion of the Brokenback CA and there are 5 cultural heritage sites of significance as depicted on Figure 1. It is considered that these sites are unlikely to be subject to degradation due to the condition and remoteness of the Brokenback CA located on the privately owned portion as described above.

Given the above factors, UCML firmly believes that the conservation objectives for this offset area and long term security can be achieved using an alternative security mechanism. UCML requests the approval of the Department of Planning and Environment (DP&E) to secure this 10ha portion of the Brokenback Conservation Area on 'Farrs Hill" via a restrictive covenant registered on the land title pursuant to the *Conveyancing Act 1919* (the Covenant).

We understand that there are precedents for this type of arrangment for mining proponents and, based on our recent discussion with the owner of the "Farrs Hill" property, this alternative security mechanism would be supported by the Landowner as it would not bind them to monitoring and reporting to the Government on the offset area in perpetuity. Further, it would be a good ecological outcome to secure the "Farrs Hill" portion of this offset area in this manner as it will avoid the need for UCML to source a replacement area that is not contiguous with the broader Brokenback Conservation Area.

The Covenant would be registered on title and would place restrictions on the use of the offset area to preserve and enhance its conservation values. The offset area would be monitored, managed and reported on for the life of the UCML Approvals in accordance with a Biodiversity Offset Management Plan (or similar) to meet conservation objectives for this offset area. Thereafter, the Covenant would remain on the title of the land. It is therefore considered that this mechanism is suitable to provide for the long term protection of the offset area on "Farrs Hill".

UCML discussed the possibility of utilising this mechanism to secure the currently approved offsets with the Department of Environment and Energy (DoEE) during a meeting to discuss the current status of long term security arrangements for UCML's offset areas on 21 February 2019. The DoEE have requested that UCML seek the DP&E's position on this before considering the suitability of this alternative mechanism from their perspective.

Offsets on Crown land

UCML have continued to work with the Department of Industry Crown Lands and Water Division (Crown Lands) to secure the CA's located on Crown land. Negotiations have been ongoing since 29 November 2012. Table 1, in Attachment B provides a summary of interactions with Crown Lands and the time and effort that UCML has invested in negotiations with Crown Lands in an attempt to reach agreement. Copies of relevant correspondence can be provided upon request.

On 25 September 2018 Crown Lands provided formal support for the UCML offsets on Crown Land, highlighting the benefits in terms of research, improvement of environmental values and to the people of NSW. This letter is provided in Attachment C.

Following submission of a new Crown Licence application on 17 September 2018 at the request of Crown Lands, UCML received a draft Licence for consideration on 7 February 2019. UCML are meeting with Crown Lands on 19 March 2019 and their legal representatives to discuss the draft licence. At that meeting UCML will also be discussing with Crown Lands the draft Conservation Agreements that are proposed to be registered on Crown land, including potential amendments to the automatic termination rights sought by Crown Lands in relation to a potential Native Title determination and in relation to Aboriginal land claims.

UCML would be appreciative of any support the Department is able to provide in this regard.

Resolution of the outstanding issues associated with the Conservation Agreements would pave the way to finalise the CA's located on Crown Land.

UCML will provide a further update to DP&F in relation to the offsets located on Crown land following the meeting with Crown Lands and will continue to progress the suitability assessment of the potential alternate offset areas located on UCML owned land. This assessment is being undertaken as a contingency in case the currently approved offsets cannot be secured (as refered to in UCML's letter dated 20 December 2018).

UCML looks forward to the Department's response in relation to the requested approval to secure the Brokenback Conservation Area on "Farrs Hill" via a Covenant on Title under the *Conveyancing Act 1919*.

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

UCML Alternate Biodiversity Offsets - Vegetation community and cliffline validation

Summary

The vegetation and cliffline habitat validation assessment undertaken for the alternate biodiversity offset areas (BOAs) has provided a preliminary identification of vegetation communities and potential cliffline habitat lengths within three land parcels (Site 1A, Site 1B and Site 1C). A summary of the results obtained during these investigations has found that:

- The three land parcels total an area of 1,400 ha.
- 952 ha of the 1,400 ha had undergone vegetation mapping under existing approvals. These areas were
 originally mapped to Biometric Vegetation Types (BVT's), with ELA's work mapping them to Plant
 Community Types (PCT's).
- The remaining 448 ha had not been previously mapped. These areas underwent high level vegetation mapping.
- Site 1A contains eight PCT's, totalling an area of approximately 350 ha, which includes approximately
 4.58 ha of vegetation that potentially meets the listing criteria for White Box Yellow Box Blakely's Red
 Gum Woodland listed as an Endangered Ecological Community (EEC) under the NSW *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* (BC Act), and White Box-Yellow Box-Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodland and
 Derived Native Grassland listed as a Critically Endangered Ecological Community (CEEC) under the
 Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act).
- Site 1B contains five PCTs, totalling an area of approximately 157 ha.
- Site 1C contains eight PCTs, totalling an area of approximately 893 ha, which includes approximately 21.23 ha of vegetation that potentially meets the listing criteria for White Box Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Woodland listed as an EEC under the BC Act, and White Box-Yellow Box-Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodland and Derived Native Grassland listed as a CEEC under the Commonwealth EPBC Act.
- Two PCTs mapped within the Crown Land portions of the Spring Gully Cliff Line Management Area (SG) and Brokenback Conservation Area (BCA) were identified within the alternate BOAs (approximately 177.67 ha), while another two PCTs that occur within the SG and BCA have not been identified within the alternate BOAs (approximately 1,447.53 ha).
- The three alternate BOAs contain a total of 25.81 ha of potential EEC/CEEC, where the SG and BCA contain no EEC/CEEC
- Cliffline habitat within the potential alternate offsets areas totals approximately 12,858 m (Site 1A 2,184 m, Site 1B 2,857 m and Site 1C 7,817 m), which is 3,122 m greater than the Crown Land portions of the SG (8,196 m) and BCA (1,540 m)

Further detailed assessments of the alternate BOAs are potentially required to confirm the suitability of the alternative BOAs, including detailed vegetation mapping, targeted threatened species surveys and fauna habitat mapping (including identification of potential maternity roost sites for the Large-eared Pied Bat, which is listed under the NSW BC Act and Commonwealth EPBC Act). The scope of further detailed assessments are pending advice from the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH).

Background

Eco Logical Australia (ELA) was engaged by Ulan Coal Mines Limited (UCML) to undertake vegetation community and cliffline habitat validation within areas that may provide alternate BOAs. It is understood that the alternate BOAs are under consideration to satisfy UCMLs current Conditions of Approval if the current BOA Crown Land Conservation Agreements are not successfully agreed.

The alternate BOAs investigated, comprised three land parcels, totalling an area of 1,400 ha, of which 952 ha have been previously surveyed by either Umwelt or ELA as part of previous impact assessments undertaken onsite, with 448 ha having not been previously surveyed.

To determine the suitability of the proposed alternate BOAs identified by UCML, ELA undertook an initial vegetation community and cliffline habitat validation field survey. This validation field survey has broadly determined if the vegetation communities and cliffline habitat within the proposed BOAs are consistent those within the current BOAs.

The vegetation community and cliffline habitat validation was undertaken within three land parcels, totalling an area of 1,400 ha. The three land parcels include:

- Site 1A approximately 350 ha
- Site 1B approximately 157 ha
- Site 1C approximately 893 ha

Methods

Vegetation community and cliffline habitat validation was undertaken by ELA ecologists S47F S47F s47F and s47F and s47F over a four day period, from the 26 to 31 October 2018. Vegetation community validation consisted of rapid assessments at numerous locations across the study area to validate the existing vegetation mapping (approximately 952 ha) and mapping of areas that have not been previously surveyed (approximately 448 ha).

Rapid assessments focused on recording dominant species in each strata layer, vegetation condition, soil type and landscape position to help determine the relevant PCT, and to help assist in determining if the PCTs meet any listed Threatened Ecological Community (TEC) under the NSW BC Act and Commonwealth EPBC Act.

Results

Vegetation community validation

The vegetation communities within the study area straddle the boundary between the Southern Brigalow Belt and the Sydney Basin Interim Biogeographic Regionalisation for Australia (IBRA) Bioregions, with the western edge of the study area located within 2 to 3 km of the South-west Slopes IBRA bioregion. Being at the boundary of a number of bioregions, there is understandably intergrading between bioregions, in that one bioregion may extend into another.

The occurrences of a number of dominant plant species found within the study area are considered to be located near the limits of their distributional range. These dominant plant species include:

- Eucalyptus crebra (Narrow-leaved Ironbark) a species which nearly reaches the tip of Cape York is near the limits of its south-western boundary at Mudgee
- Eucalyptus punctata (Grey Gum) extends from coastal SE Queensland to Jervis Bay in NSW and is at its western limit
- Eucalyptus sparsifolia (Narrow-leaved Stringybark) extends from the eastern Pilliga diagonally south to Wollongong and is near its western limit.

Although a number of vegetation community plant species are near their western limits, the PCTs that most accurately reflect vegetation of the study area are those deriving from work undertaken by Benson (2010) for the southern Brigalow Belt Biogeographic area and are found entering the Sydney Basin.

Thirteen PCTs were validated and mapped across the three land parcels (maps provided in Attachment A). These PCTs were distributed across each land parcel, with eight PCTs validated within Site 1A, five PCTs validated within Site 1B, and eight PCTs validated and mapped within Site 1C (Table 1). The PCTs validated and mapped across the land parcels, along with general descriptions for each PCT listed on the Vegetation Information System database (OEH) include:

- Rough-Barked Apple Red Gum Yellow Box woodland on alluvial clay to loam soils on valley flats in the northern NSW South Western Slopes Bioregion and Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (PCT 281) – this PCT is a widespread community that occurs on black, brown and grey alluvial and colluvial clay loam, loam or sandy loam soils derived from a range of substrates on valley flats and footslopes in valleys in hill landform patterns mainly in the Brigalow Belt South Bioregion. Some areas also occur north of Mudgee in the Gulgong-Dunedoo area in the NSW South-western Slopes Bioregion.
- Grey Box cypress pine red gum woodland on deep sandy loam soil in northern NSW Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (PCT 374) – this PCT occurs on well drained deep light brown sand loam soils often derived from granite on lower slopes, valleys in hill landscape patterns in the Yetman district in the far northern part of the Brigalow Belt South Bioregion in NSW. This community is mainly cleared and overgrazed with soil erosion in places. Grey Box mainly occurs east of the Great Dividing Range but extends to the western side of the range as far west as this area. It forms a separate association with Narrow-leaved Ironbark on fine-grained sediments on hills near Ashford in the Nandewar Bioregion to the east, and other associations to the south in the Nandewar Bioregion.
- Rough-barked Apple Blakely's Red Gum Black Cypress Pine woodland on sandy flats, mainly in the Pilliga Scrub region (PCT 401) – this PCT occurs on clayey sand or sandy clay loam soils derived from sandstone on valley flats in low hill and rises landscapes mainly in the mid to eastern Pilliga Scrub forests. Grades into similar riparian woodland along creeks (ID399).
- Tumbledown Gum woodland on hills in the northern NSW South Western Slopes Bioregion and southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (PCT 461) – this PCT occurs on shallow to stony brown to red sandy loam to light clay soils derived from metasediments or granite on hillslopes, hillcrests and gullies in rises, low hills and hills landform patterns mainly in the Gulgong - Dunedoo - Goolma - Tanner Springs region in the NSW South-western Slopes Bioregion with minor outliers to the north at the southern edge of the Brigalow Belt South Bioregion. It is likely also located in the Capertee Valley south of Mudgee. Mostly cleared and overgrazed with some pasture weed infestation. A poorly protected and threatened community.
- Red gum Rough-barked Apple Narrow-leaved Ironbark cypress pine grassy open forest on flats and drainage lines in the Goonoo and surrounding forests, southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (PCT 473) this PCT occurs on sand to sandy loam soils derived from sandstone or present as alluvium in drainage depressions, footslopes, and along creeks in low hill landscapes in the Goonoo forest region in the far south of the Brigalow Belt South Bioregion. This PCT is well represented in reserves.

- Inland Scribbly Gum Red Stringybark Black Cypress Pine Red Ironbark open forest on sandstone hills in the southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion and northern NSW South Western Slopes Bioregion (PCT 477) - this PCT occurs on sandy loam to clayey sands soils derived from sandstone on hillcrests and hillslopes in hill landform patterns in the Dunedoo - Merriwa region of the extreme south BBS Bioregion overlapping into the NSW SWS Bioregion. This community grades into a similar community dominated by Red Ironbark (Eucalyptus fibrosa) (ID478) and also into the Dapper Mugga Ironbark community (ID403)
- Red Ironbark Black Cypress Pine stringybark +/- Narrow-leaved Wattle shrubby open forest on sandstone in the Gulgong Mendooran region, southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (PCT 478) -- this PCT occurs on sandy loam to clayey sand soils derived from sandstone, siltstone, shale or slate on footslopes, hillcrests and hillslopes in hill and low hill landform patterns in the Dunedoo Merriwa region of the extreme south BBS Bioregion overlapping into the NSW SWS Bioregion and upper Hunter Valley and Capertee Valley. This community grades into a similar community dominated by Inland Scribbly Gum Red Stringybark open forest (ID477), into the Dapper Mugga Ironbark community (ID403) and a Narrow-leaved Ironbark Black Cypress Pine shrubby community (ID479) on sandstones. Partly cleared.
- Narrow-leaved Ironbark- Black Cypress Pine stringybark +/- Grey Gum +/- Narrow-leaved Wattle shrubby open forest on sandstone hills in the southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion and Sydney Basin Bioregion (PCT 479) – this PCT occurs on red-brown loamy clay to sandy loam soils derived from sandstone, siltstone and shale in hill and low hill landforms in the southern BBS, northern NSW SWS and north-western Sydney Basin Bioregions.
- Grey Box x White Box grassy open woodland on basalt hills in the Merriwa region, upper Hunter Valley (PCT 483) this PCT occurs on brown to black earth, chocolate loam to clay soils derived from basalt on hillslopes, hillcrests, footslopes and valley flats on rolling hills and low hills on the Merriwa Plain and lower southern slopes of the Liverpool Range in the upper Hunter Valley in the far south-eastern corner of the Brigalow Belt South Bioregion. This PCT is mainly cleared, however is listed as part of the grassy box-gum woodland EEC in both the EPBC and NSW TSC Acts. Threatened by fragmentation, weed invasion, tree dieback and intensive agricultural development of ground cover. Very poorly or not represented in protected areas as of 2009.
- Derived tall spear grass grassland on mainly basalt hills of the Liverpool Plains, Liverpool Range and in the upper Hunter Valley (Merriwa district), south-eastern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (PCT 484) – this PCT occurs on black or brown clay soils derived from fine-grained sedimentary or basalt substrates on flats, hillslopes, hillcrests and gullies in low hill and hill landforms mainly in the Liverpool Plains, Liverpool Ranges and Kerrabee IBRA sub-regions.
- Narrow-leaved Ironbark +/- Grey Box grassy woodland of the upper Hunter Valley, mainly Sydney Basin Bioregion (PCT 623) – this PCT occurs on brown clay soil derived from fine-grained sedimentary substrates on hillcrests and upper hillslopes in hill and low hill landforms from 70 m to 350 m altitude with about 1000 mm rainfall in the central to upper parts of the Hunter Valley around Scone. Not well protected in reserves and mostly cleared.
- Large-fruited Grey Gum Narrow-leaved Stringybark open forest on sheltered sandstone hillslopes in the Scone region of the upper Hunter Valley (PCT 624) this PCT occurs on shallow sandy loam soil derived from conglomerate or sandstone substrate on sheltered hillslopes in the Scone region of the upper Hunter Valley mainly in the Sydney Basin Bioregion.
- Blakely's Red Gum Narrow-leaved Ironbark Rough-barked Apple shrubby woodland of the upper Hunter (PCT 1607) -- this PCT is found on valley flats and lower slopes within the ranges of central and upper Hunter Valley and Northern Wollemi NP at mid to low elevations on sandstone.

The breakdown of the area of each PCT within each land parcel surveyed is provided below in **Table 1**. The dominant PCTs across all three land parcels include Tumbledown Gum woodland on hills in the northern NSW South Western Slopes Bioregion and southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (Site 1C only), Red Ironbark - Black

Cypress Pine - stringybark +/- Narrow-leaved Wattle shrubby open forest on sandstone in the Gulgong - Mendooran region, southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (Site 1A, Site 1B and Site 1C), and Narrow-leaved Ironbark- Black Cypress Pine - stringybark +/- Grey Gum +/- Narrow-leaved Wattle shrubby open forest on sandstone hills in the southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion and Sydney Basin Bioregion (Site 1A, Site 1B and Site 1C).

Vegetation mapping completed across the alternative BOAs has been compared with vegetation mapping completed across existing BOAs at UCML where parcels of the existing BOAs are located on Crown Land. The existing BOAs that contain Crown Land include SG and BCA.

PCTs that are common across both the existing BOAs (SG and BCA) and alternative BOAs include Red Ironbark - Black Cypress Pine - stringybark +/- Narrow-leaved Wattle shrubby open forest on sandstone in the Gulgong - Mendooran region, southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion (PCT 478), and Narrow-leaved Ironbark- Black Cypress Pine - stringybark +/- Grey Gum +/- Narrow-leaved Wattle shrubby open forest on sandstone hills in the southern Brigalow Belt South Bioregion and Sydney Basin Bioregion (PCT 479).

Table 2 shows the PCTs present within the Crown Land owned areas of Spring Gully and Brokenback Conservation Areas only. Areas of these Conservation Areas that are owned by UCML or private landowners has been excluded.

Cliffline validation

Cliffline habitat within the alternative BOAs consists of cliffline habitat previously mapped within the UCML project area. Field observations did NOT make any changes to the mapped cliffline habitat (Attachment B). Site 1A has 2,184 m of mapped cliffline habitat, Site 1B has 2,857 m of mapped cliffline habitat, and Site 1C has 7,817 m of mapped cliffline habitat.

In comparison to the existing BOAs (SG and BCA), the three alternative BOAs have a combined cliffline habitat length of 12,858 m, which is 3,122 m more than the existing BOAs (SG has 8,196 m of mapped cliffline habitat, and BCA has 1,540 m of mapped cliffline habitat).

Threatened Ecological Communities and species

The threatened ecological community, Box-Gum Woodland, can potentially be attributed to three PCTs within the alternative BOAs, PCT 281, PCT 483 and PCT 484 (Attachment C). These PCTs could potentially meet the listing criteria for White Box Yellow Box Blakely's Red Gum Woodland listed as an EEC under the NSW BC Act, and White Box-Yellow Box-Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodland and Derived Native Grassland listed as a CEEC under the Commonwealth EPBC Act. The total area of potential EEC/CEEC within the alternative BOAs is 25.81 ha.

In comparison to the existing BOAs (SG and BCA), the three alternative BOAs have 25.81 ha more EEC/CEEC, with both the SG and BCA BOAs containing no EEC/CEEC.

Threatened flora and fauna species observed within the potential alternative BOAs included one threatened flora species and four threatened fauna species (Attachment D), and include:

- Acacia ausfeldii (Ausfeld's Wattle) vulnerable under the BC Act, and was located at one location
 within Site 1A and two locations within Site 1B
- Calyptorhynchus lathami (Glossy Black-cockatco) vulnerable under the BC Act, was observed at two locations within Site 1A, one location within Site 1B and one location within Site 1C


- Grantiella picta (Painted Honeyeater) vulnerable under the BC Act and EPBC Act, was observed at four locations within Site 1A, one location within Site 1B and two locations within Site 1C
- Chthonicola sagittata (Speckled Warbler) vulnerable under the BC Act, and was observed at one location within Site 1A
- Climacteris picumnus victoriae (Brown Treecreeper (eastern subspecies)) -- vulnerable under the BC
 Act, and was observed at one location within Site 1B.





Attachment A - Vegetation community mapping











Attachment B - Potential EEC/CEEC mapping










Attachment C – Cliffline habitat mapping
