Good to catch up today.

As you know, I've spent a considerable amount of time in Mutitjulu and around Ulu<u>r</u>u over the years and have a substantial and unique library of photographs and film/video footage that I'd like to see used for the benefit of Anangu and the Park.

I've previously provided images for use by the Park and by the Director of Parks Australia, at no cost, for everything from visitor brochures to Christmas cards and, for the Handback celebrations around 2005, produced a full-length film about Handback for the community. This was shown on a large screen in the community on or around the 26 October and also on the big screen in Yulara.

This year's Handback celebration is clearly of great importance and I'd be interested in documenting the closure of the climb on video and, again, in assisting Anangu and the Park if I can. I'm just heading back to Alice Springs now, but will be back at Uluru next week (Mon-Wed). Might it be possible to catch up and have a meeting, perhaps with you and or other media personnel, to see what would be of interest to you, and what I might be able to do.

My previous work had *mala* and the climb (with special permission) as significant components and I think this could help make a strong film (whether short or long) for possible screening on or around 26 October, either locally or perhaps even nationally. I would also be happy to come to an arrangement for usage of footage taken with Anangu

and/or the Park; I think it's important for Anangu to have long-term, reliable access to such material for potential future use.

I look forward to hearing back from you and hope we may be able to meet next week. I should be seeing in Alice this week (if he's over the flu) - I understand he may have talked to you about the value of documenting the climb closure - and would hope that he could be directly involved with this project, not least with interpretation.

FILMING PROPOSAL: HANDBACK 2019

Following the interest expressed by some Anangu, along with Parks Australia, to document the special events associated with the closure of The Climb in 2019, I would like to make the following offer and proposal:

- 1. I would be happy to film, to a professional standard, events surrounding the 2019 celebration of Handback at Uluru Kata Tjuta National Park, including the closure of the climb, as directed and/or requested by Anangu and Parks staff;
- 2. I would make all such material available to Anangu and Parks for the purposes of archives, record-keeping and potential use online;
- 3. I would like the opportunity of using approved parts of this material to update the film I made in 2005 for screening in Mu<u>t</u>itjulu and Yulara, celebrating the 20th Anniversary of Handback, and to further promote the natural and cultural values of the Park.

I would be happy to discuss any aspects of this proposal in person, or via video-conferencing with the Committee.

BACKGROUND

first visited Uluru in 1980-81, nearly 40 years ago, and began living in Mutitjulu (and subsequently Yulara) in 1994. He is an experienced film-maker making films of high quality that have been shown (and received awards) around the world. His films about Kakadu National Park and about camels in central Australia, for instance, have been very popular and have been seen by large audiences in over 50 countries.

He has also served on the Boards of prestigious film industry bodies, such as the Australian Directors Guild and Australian Cinematographers Society, and local groups such as the Alice Desert Festival, as part of which he founded a long-running film festival in Alice Springs.

Throughout his time in central Australia, he has contributed to Uluru – Kata Tjuta National Park through providing photos for use by Parks Australia, taking unique pictures of special events (such as the building and opening of the Cultural Centre), producing a film to celebrate the 20th Anniversary of Handback as part of that year's celebrations, and providing detailed advice to the Park and Anangu on revisions of the Film and Photography guidelines on behalf of professional film-makers and photographers in the Northern Territory. He has not asked for, or received, any payment for these services.

This proposal provides a further opportunity of *ngapartji ngapartji* and of creating valuable images from Ulu<u>r</u>u for the future.


Under our Management Plan drone use needs to be approved by the board but we do have a consult process in place which is why all applications for drone use need to be lodged 6 weeks in advance at least.

Drone use for all media also needs to be accompanied by two senior cultural authority and they both need to be paid \$500 each.

Yes, you suggested the idea to and myself but no approval or permit was ever provided.

I think we've both been pretty busy over the past few weeks so it will be good to catch up this morning to run through a few matters. I'll be back at Park HQ from about midday onwards.

1. EXPENSES

You asked me to let me know of the expenses I'd incurred in shooting material of the Board of Management etc. For your interest, these are some of my company's outgoings (ex GST) to film/photograph the Board, interviews and climb closure:

\$4273: Invoices from - camerawork, editing, uploading/distributing footage (BOM footage)
\$775: Basic travel expenses for \$890: Flights for to/from Uluru

\$400: Production of 1-2 min video of cairn removal (part of \$3000 fee for work/equipment)

Please let me know what expenses you'd be interested in covering. [As you can imagine from Parks' budget of up to 30K for just a 3-day tender/shoot, the total, full budget for my company's work August-November 2019, including my own time and equipment, exceeds that figure of 30K. But, I think we're all in agreement that the material we're collecting is important and will be of significant value and interest in future.]

I'd also like to discuss a few other aspects of this work, including protocols for ongoing filming and the possibility of showing a finished, top quality film at some future venue in or near the Park.
