Proposed handling of 'major projects' subject to assessment under the EPBC Act

Overview

As part of implementing the Government's congestion busting agenda in relation to environmental approvals, the Department proposes to manage a small number of the most nationally-significant projects as 'major projects'. Assessment of these projects will be afforded the highest priority and will be resourced and managed with a view to ensure key decisions are made within <u>agreed</u> timeframes.


The Department will recommend projects for 'major project' status to you for approval and will provide regular reports to you on the Department's performance in managing the major projects.

Recommendation of major projects to you will be based on an evaluation against agreed criteria which focuses on economic contribution and strategic significance of the projects (see below).

What is the proposed initial set of major projects?

The Department's proposed initial list of major projects comprises:

• Santos NSW (Eastern) Pty Ltd's Narrabri Gas Project, NSW



What criteria will be used to identify major projects?

The proposed criteria for major project selection are outlined below. Equal weightings will apply to the proposed criteria.

- strategic significance: for example, critical national infrastructure which will facilitate further growth, investment and job creation or to meet critical community needs
- economic contribution: having regard to key indicators such as expected revenue, upfront and ongoing employment opportunities, and capital expenditure
- other Government policy objectives

What can proponents of major projects expect from the Department?

The Department will negotiate a client service charter with the proponent for each major project. The service charter will provide proponents with greater certainty about the assessment process, including roles and expectations of parties, timeframes for key decisions, and any necessary caveats or contingencies regarding timing. Importantly (noting that these projects are typically much more complex than standard projects), the timeframes negotiated in the service charter are expected to be longer than statutory timeframes.

The service charter for each project will make no commitment or guarantee about the decision outcome.

What reporting will be done on Major Projects?

The Department will provide a regular report to you on our performance with meeting timeframes for major projects as part of our congestion busting performance reporting (see <u>Attachment B</u> to brief).

Appendix A: Further information on proposed major projects

Narrabri Gas Project

A proposal by Santos to develop a coal seam gas field in the Gunnedah Basin of New South Wales is being assessed under the EPBC Act bilateral assessment agreement with the New South Wales Government.

The Narrabri Gas Project has been mentioned by the NSW Premier as one of several possible options, if approved, for providing additional gas to the East Coast market under the \$2 billion energy deal between the Australian and NSW Governments announced in January 2020.

The proposed action involves: exploration and appraisal activities, installation of up to 850 CSG wells, the development and operation of gas and water gathering systems, a central gas processing facility, water treatment facilities and supporting infrastructure (including power generation and distribution, communications, roads and operational management facilities).



Thank you for your correspondence of 5 February 2020 on behalf of your constituentS47Fconcerning the SANTOS Narrabri Gas proposal.

The Australian Government plays an important role in protecting our environment from the potential impacts of development activity, with a focus on matters of national environmental significance. In the case of coal seam gas developments, this includes potential impacts on water resources. The Australian Government's regulatory regime works in concert with state and territory governments, which have primary responsibility for water resources and regulating environmental impacts associated with the resources sector.

The Narrabri Gas proposal is currently being assessed under Australia's national environmental law, the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act), for the proposal's impacts on nationally threatened species and ecological communities, a water resource in relation to a coal seam gas development and impacts on Commonwealth land in the region. Together with the NSW Government, I have sought the best available independent scientific advice on the proposal from the Independent Expert Scientific Committee on Coal Seam Gas and Large Coal Mining Development (IESC). This advice is an important part of the proposal's assessment and SANTOS will need to address the issues raised in the advice in its environmental assessment. The IESC's advice for the proposal is available on the IESC website at: iesc.environment.gov.au/advice/scientific-advice.

All relevant matters regarding the environmental impacts of the proposal will be considered before a decision is made on whether to approve the proposal. These considerations include impacts on water resources, nationally protected species and ecological communities in the Pilliga region, and any public comments received during the proposal's exhibition period.

The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment has provided the NSW Independent Planning Commission (IPC) with a copy of its assessment report for the Narrabri Gas Project. This commences the IPC assessment process for the project. Please find below an update on the assessment and talking points, if needed.

Narrabri Gas Project, Gunnedah Basin, NSW (EPBC 2014/7376) – Assessment update (as at 12 June 2020)

- The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment has completed its comprehensive assessment of the Narrabri Gas Project and has referred the proposal to the NSW Independent Planning Commission (IPC) for public hearing and final determination.
- The NSW Minister for Planning and Public Spaces has requested the IPC hold the public hearing and determine the development application within 12 weeks of receiving the NSW assessment report. However, the IPC can request additional information and an extension to this timeframe if necessary.
 - The public hearing will be held online, in place of a face-to-face hearing, in line with new requirements issued by the NSW Government in response to the COVID19 pandemic. Proceedings of the hearing will be streamed live online, and a transcript published on the IPC website.
- The process for deciding whether to approve the project under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) will commence following completion of the NSW Government's assessment and approval process, expected later this year.

<u>Background</u>

- The Narrabri Gas Project requires assessment and approval under the EPBC Act. The proposal is being assessed under the bilateral agreement with the NSW Government. The project includes the installation of up to 850 CSG wells, on up to 425 new well pads, in the Gunnedah Basin, south-west of Narrabri. Estimated gas production is up to 200 terajoules of natural gas per day.

Talking points

- A proposal by Santos to develop a coal seam gas field in the Gunnedah Basin of New South Wales is being assessed under the EPBC Act bilateral assessment agreement with the New South Wales Government.

- The process for deciding whether to approve the project under the EPBC Act will commence following completion of the New South Wales Government's assessment and approval process under State law.
