

Biosecurity Protection Levy: proposed rates

10 May 2024

The Federal Budget announcement in May 2023 indicated that the final design of the Biosecurity Protection Levy (BPL), and ongoing approach to industry engagement, governance and reporting would be settled after a public consultation process. It is intended that the Biosecurity Protection Levy would be imposed in the most effective and efficient way for each product, aligning wherever possible with imposition arrangements under the Primary Industries Levies legislation. This document provides the proposed rate of Biosecurity Protection Levy which have been communicated to relevant industry representative bodies.

It must be noted that details of each commodity's levy and charges rates would be set out in regulations and subject to consideration by the Governor-General in Federal Executive Council. The final levy rates may also be dependent on further consultation and subject to rounding.

The department will be publishing proposed rates in a staged approach. The list below is for the first tranche of commodities, we anticipate additional commodities to be added in coming weeks.

^{*} Vegetables includes artichokes, beans, beetroot, broccoli, baby broccoli (including broccolini), Brussels sprouts, cabbage, capsicums/bell peppers, carrots, cauliflower, celery, chillies, cucumbers, eggplants, English spinach, silverbeet, kale, leafy Asian vegetables, leafy salad vegetables (e.g. rocket and baby spinach), leeks, head lettuce, parsley, parsnips, peas, pumpkins, sweet corn, zucchini, all other vegetables except asparagus, garlic, onions, herbs, mushrooms, potatoes, sweet potatoes and tomatoes.

^{**} The proposed BPL for meat chickens is to be imposed on meat chickens that are hatched at a hatchery in Australia.

^{***} The proposed BPL for pigs is to be imposed on the slaughter in Australia at an abattoir of pigs for human consumption.

[^] The proposed BPL for ratites is to be imposed on the slaughter in Australia at an abattoir of ratites for human consumption.
