Hi Kristy,

As discussed, please find **<u>attached</u>** talking points and background briefing in preparation for your upcoming meeting on Friday 17 July with Perth Airport Pty Ltd.

As you are aware, the Department has been engaging with Perth Airport over recent months in relation to our assessment of their new runway development. The proposed development will result in impacts to a range of ecologically important values and this is reflected in the draft set of conditions we have been consulting on with Perth Airport recently.

The runway development is being assessed through an accredited arrangement under the Airports Act which is administered by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Cities and Regional Development. Under these arrangements, the Environment Minister (or her delegate) provides advice on matters necessary to protect the environment (including recommended conditions of approval) to the Infrastructure Minister who has ultimate responsibility for making the decision of whether or not to approve the project under the Airports Act.

Perth Airport have objected to a number of the proposed recommended conditions which would require the approval of management plans (including in relation to offsets) by the Minister for the Environment prior to an impact to a protected matter occurring. They have also noted that the EPBC Act does not have a statutory timeframe for the assessment of management plans and are seeking to require approval timeframes to be embedded in the approval conditions.

Representatives from Perth Airport are likely to raise these concerns with you. Further information on Perth Airport's concerns is outlined in the email below. The Department is committed to working closely with Perth Airport to enable timely approval of the required management plans and has committed to enter into a client service charter arrangement to facilitate this process.

Following your meeting we would appreciate your advice as to whether we can proceed with finalising advice to Infrastructure or if the Minister would like to make the decision. Happy to discuss further on that front.

Hi Greg, s22 , s22 and Team

Thank you for meeting with the Perth Airport team yesterday to discuss the Draft NRP conditions. We appreciate your time and I wanted to follow up to reiterate our discussion around timing in particular, as follows;

- DAWE's commitment to establish a Client Services Charter for the management plan review process is welcome, but PAPL's strong preference is for this charter to include specified timeframes to allow for the planning and delivery of the project in the most efficient manner (timeframes to include 'stop the clock' provisions if further detail is required from PAPL). I recognise that DAWE have indicated the inclusion of timeframes is not possible, but regardless, I would like to reiterate that this is our strong preference.
- As per above, it is also our strong preference that the Draft Conditions include stated timeframes for approvals (again with 'stop the clock' provisions where information provided is insufficient). Again, this will allow for an optimal delivery program to be established.
- Notwithstanding the above, we maintain that the pre-commencement conditions (for works impacting a protected matter) should not be reliant on the approval of Management Plans. Also, we maintain that the AEO appointed by DITRDC should approve all management plans (with the exception of offsets) under the Airports Act and associated regulations.

In addition to the above key items, other take-aways from yesterday's meeting include;

- PAPL recognise that consistency of DAWE officers on the project has been beneficial in this iterative process and we welcome maintenance of this consistency wherever possible
- Sensible definition is required for protected matters (for example, Barnaby's Black Cockatoo foraging habitat) with low habitat quality scores (between 1 and 3)
- Pre-clearing surveys to determine the number of individual plants (for example in Draft Condition number 1)
- Draft condition number 4 to be reworded to include: To mitigate the loss *and reduce residual impact*...
- Several conditions to be bundled together
- Some management plans can be combined (with the exception of offsets)
- PAPL agree that the Offset Plan will likely be the most difficult and as such, we will focus our initial work in this area
- OEMP approval should not be a pre-commencement condition, but rather a pre-operating condition
- The next version of the draft conditions will be provided to PAPL for information only, with

DAWE submission to DITRDC as soon as possible

We look forward to resolving the draft conditions and as always, are happy to discuss progression as required.

Perth Airport new runway project (EPBC 2017-8081)

Key points:

- The Minister is committed to delivering on the Prime Minister's agenda to reduce the timeframes for assessment and approval of major projects, while maintaining strong environmental safeguards.
- The Minister recognises the vital importance of this project and wants to ensure that there is a pathway for approval of the project, underpinned by a comprehensive assessment and arrangements for managing environmental impacts.
- The Perth Airport new runway project is a large project and will impact on a number of sensitive ecological values and the proposed conditions reflect this.
- I understand that Perth Airport Pty Ltd want certainty that the approval of management plans proposed as conditions of approval will not impact their ability to deliver the project in a timely manner.
- The Department has committed to continue working collaboratively with Perth Airport to support the timely approval of management plans. Perth Airport also have an important role in facilitating this by providing the information required to satisfy any approval conditions which are ultimately established under the Airports Act.

Context and Background Information:

- In September 2019, the draft Major Development Plan (MDP) for the new runway project at Perth Airport was submitted. The Department shared draft conditions of approval with the proponent in June this year for comment.
- The project consists of the construction, including clearing and site preparation, of a new parallel runway at Perth Airport which is proposed to be operational between 2023 and 2028.
- The runway assessment is being undertaken through an accredited arrangement under the Airports Act which is administered by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Cities and Regional Development. Under these arrangements, the Minister (or her delegate) provides advice on matters necessary to protect the environment to the Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development (Minister for Infrastructure) who has portfolio responsibility for making the decision of whether or not to approve the project under the Airports Act.

- As the project is being undertaken on Commonwealth land, impacts to the whole of the environment have been considered. The project will result in impacts to the endangered Banksia Woodland of the Swan Coastal Plain threatened ecological community, two listed flora species (Wavy-leaved Smokebush and Keighery's Macarthuria), three listed blackcockatoo species, wetlands and the heritage values of Munday Swamp.
- The Department has received correspondence from environment NGOs in Western Australia expressing concern about impacts to the environment resulting from this project.
- Perth Airport Pty Ltd are seeking certainty that the approval of management plans proposed as conditions of approval will not impact their ability to deliver the project.
- Perth Airport Pty Ltd have also raised objections to the proposed conditions which require offsets to be approved by the Minister before they can impact protected matters as part of the action. The EPBC Act offsets policy specifies a preference for offsets to be timely and implemented before or at the time of impact. The Department has raised this issue with Perth Airport on a number of occasions dating back to 2018.
- Talking points on each of the issues likely to be raised by Perth Airport are provided at <u>Attachment A</u>, and further detail on key dates is provided in <u>Attachment B</u>.

Attachment A – Talking points

If concerns are raised regarding the time taken for the Department to recommend a decision:

- I appreciate your concerns about the time taken to reach a decision on this project. I want to assure you that the Minister is committed to ensuring that assessment and approval timeframes for major projects are reduced, while maintaining strong environmental safeguards.
- As you are aware, the new runway is a complex project and will impact on a number of sensitive ecological values. As the project is located on Commonwealth land, it requires an assessment of the whole of the environment which adds an additional level of complexity above what might normally be considered during an assessment.
- Since the draft MDP was received by the Department in September last year, I am aware that the Department requested additional information, including in relation to a number of outstanding matters that date back to the Department's initial advice provided to you in 2018 (for example information demonstrating whether or not the Clay Pans of the Swan Coastal Plain threatened ecological community occurs on the Perth Airport estate).
 - I note that continued engagement on these proposed conditions, which the Department has undertaken at Perth Airport's request, has also delayed finalisation of advice to the Infrastructure Minister.

If required:

- I understand that as part of the accredited assessment process, the Department provided comment on previous versions of the major development plan documentation, and that these comments were provided to Perth Airport to inform the preparation of the draft MDP prior to submission to the Department.
- Feedback provided by the Department, dating back to 2018, raised a number of matters including the level of detail provided in relation to environmental impacts and the need for a detailed offset proposal.

If concerns are raised regarding timeframes for the Minister for the Environment approving management plans:

- I appreciate your need for certainty regarding the timely approval of management plans and understand your concerns that the EPBC Act does not provide statutory timeframes for the approval of these plans.
- The Government is committed to working cooperatively with Perth Airport to facilitate the timely approval of the management plans whilst ensuring the environmental outcomes sought through the conditions are achieved.
- I understand that the Department has committed to immediately work with your team to develop a Client Service Charter, that includes indicative timeframes for delivery by both parties, and provide upfront guidance on the information required to be provided in the Plans.
- As you will appreciate, the ability of the Department to recommend approval of a management plan relies on the quality of the information presented by Perth Airport and whether the plan addresses the requirements outlined in the final conditions of approval.

If asked why the recommended conditions couldn't provide for an Airport Environment Officer (AEO) to approve required management plans instead of the Environment Minister:

- Commonwealth Environment Ministers have been consistent in recommending that management plans required for nationally protected matters are approved by the Minister or their delegate.
- It is my understanding that while conditions for previous projects approved under the Airports Act may have allowed for an Airport Environment Officer to approve management plans, this has not been the case for plans recommended by the Minister for the Environment.

If pressed (in relation to previous project conditions of approval):

- Conditions recommended by the Department for the <u>Southern Aviation support precinct</u> and <u>taxiway Charlie extension</u> related to land clearing only.
- Conditions attached to the Ministerial approval which allowed for plans to be submitted to an AEO in relation to the <u>taxiway extension at Perth Airport</u> were recommended by another Commonwealth agency, not the Environment Minister or Department.
- The Department did not provide advice to the Minister for Infrastructure for the <u>Bravo office</u> <u>building project</u>. I understand that the Infrastructure Minister's approval includes conditions for AEO approval of plans.

If concerns are raised in relation to the requirement to provide offsets prior to undertaking impact to protected matters:

- The Perth Airport estate is home to a range of important ecological values in the Perth region. I note the commitments that you have made in relation to environmental management on the estate and I understand you have had some good success with revegetation in some areas.
- I understand you are concerned that conditions requiring offset plans to be approved prior to impact may constrain Perth Airport's operations.
- This requirement minimises the impacts on the nationally protected matters resulting from time delays in delivering the offsets, and is consistent with the EPBC Act Environmental Offsets Policy and the approach taken with the broader regulated community.
- I am aware that the Department has communicated these requirements to Perth Airport since this project was referred in 2018.
- Further, as Perth Airport have not yet delivered offsets required by recent EPBC Permit conditions (i.e. for Site 6 Large format retail development and living stream permits), this requirement provides us with greater confidence that offsets will be able to be delivered for this proposed action.

If required:

 In February 2018, the Department requested the major development plan be updated to include an offset strategy that identified milestones, timelines, targets, budgets and preferably locations of land purchases for relevant matters.

- In April 2018, the Department reiterated that advice and noted that the Department's offset policy specifies offsets should be implemented either before or at the same point as the impact arising from the action.
- In responding to the February 2018 letter, Perth Airport advised of its intent to prepare a whole of estate offset strategy for incorporation into the draft MDP. I understand a whole of estate offset strategy has not been provided to date.
- Between 2018 and now, I understand that Perth Airport has met with the Department on a number of occasions to discuss an offset strategy related to two other MDPs, however, no offsets have so far been secured under this strategy.

If asked about consistency with other EPBC Act decisions:

- As you are aware, we recommend conditions to protect the environment be attached to the approval issued by the Minister for Infrastructure under the Airports Act.
- Noting the nature and complexity of this project, the Department has conducted a thorough assessment. The recommended conditions for the project are consistent with those that would be attached if this project were being assessed and approved under the EPBC Act.
- It is open to the Minister for Infrastructure not to apply the conditions as recommended by the Environment Minister or her delegate.

If required: Example of a neighboring project with similar requirements:

The Perth Airport and Freight access project (EPBC 2010/5834) includes conditions requiring an environmental offset strategy and a CEMP to be approved by the Minister for the Environment at least one month prior to commencement of construction.

Just further to our discussion the other day on Perth Airport...

as you are aware, the Department is currently assessing the proposed new runway for Perth Airport. The runway assessment is being undertaken through an accredited arrangement under the Airports Act which is administered by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Cities and Regional Development. Under these arrangements, the Minister (or her delegate) provides advice on matters necessary to protect the environment to the Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development (Minister for Infrastructure) who has portfolio responsibility for making the decision of whether or not to approve the project under the Airports Act.

- The Department is proposing the Minister or delegate recommends eight robust conditions to the Minister for Infrastructure for inclusion as conditions of approval under the Airports Act. The conditions include the requirement to prepare management plans to minimise the impact of the project on the environment.
- The project will result in residual significant impacts to Banksia Woodland of the Swan Coastal Plain threatened ecological community, two listed flora species (Wavy-leaved Smokebush and Keighery's Macarthuria) and three listed black-cockatoo species through loss of foraging and potential breeding habitat.
- The proposed action may result in impacts to the environment from the potential disturbance and/or mobilisation of PFAS contaminated material, impacts to wetlands and heritage values of the estate including the cultural heritage values of Munday Swamp.
- The Department is proposing to recommend the inclusion of offset conditions to compensate for the impact to these protected matters in line with departmental policy.

Further background information about the proposed new runway is provided below. Appreciate your advice as to whether the Minister will approve the advice under the accredited arrangement processes to be provided to the Minister for Infrastructure or if she would like this to be the Delegates decision. We will be meeting with Perth Airport later today to discuss proposed final conditions. I will let you know how that goes and if they are likely to escalate. Greg

Background:

- The project consists of the construction, including clearing and site preparation, of a new parallel runway at Perth Airport which is proposed to be operational between 2023 and 2028.
- As the project is being undertaken on Commonwealth land, impacts to the whole of the environment have been considered as part of the assessment completed by the

Department.

- The project will result in impacts to the endangered Banksia Woodland of the Swan Coastal Plain threatened ecological community, two listed flora species (Wavy-leaved Smokebush and Keighery's Macarthuria), three listed black-cockatoo species, wetlands and the heritage values of Munday Swamp.
- The Department has received correspondence from numerous environmental groups in Western Australia expressing concern about impacts to the environment resulting from this project.
- On 1 August 2019, Minister Ley made a decision under the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island Heritage Protection Act 1984* (Cth) not to protect Munday Swamp as a specified area on the basis that amongst other things the new runway project would not be commercially viable and would not be able to meet state and national needs if a declaration was made to protect the site.
