✓ Streamlining trading requirements and facilitating exports will help drive economic recovery nationally, particularly in rural, regional, and remote Australia. When implemented the reforms will contribute to generating at least \$236 million by 2030 of other benefits to industry.

Digital Foundations

Delivered **early digital foundations for the program**: an upgraded core export certificate platform, a new cloud enabled platform for building new digital services, and a development platform

Released closed trial of initial digital registration services allowing exporters to add or remove their staff themselves – one of the most common changes made

Developed a proof of concept for a digital services gateway to allow industry to integrate directly with export systems and data

Completed uptake of **paperless certification**: paperless trade with NZ, USA, Japan, Canada and the Philippines; paperless certification for pre-clearance for China, Korea, Malaysia, Indonesia and Taiwan

Live animal exports reform

Agreed five projects with livestock industry which will provide savings in compliance costs

Developed and implemented a **regulatory training framework** to improve staff capability and culture

Strengthened **internal policies and procedures**, including introducing a new Compliance Statement for the Export of Livestock; updating customer service standards
