Target efforts to improve compliance for exporters

- ✓ We implement services to make it easier for our exporters to access export systems, understand the rules, meet their obligations.



Downward pressure on costs of regulation for the department

- ✓ Implement reforms that will significantly transform our processes and how we engage with exporters. These changes will result in the costs of regulatory services being covered by fees and charges by 2023-24, by at least \$21.4 million less than if no reforms occurred.



Market Access Gains and Other Economic Benefits to Industry

- ✓ Streamlining trading requirements and facilitating exports will help drive economic recovery nationally, particularly in rural, regional, and remote Australia. When implemented the reforms will contribute to generating at least \$236 million by 2030 of other benefits to industry.
