

Section F: Privacy notice

'Personal information' is defined in the *Privacy Act 1998* and includes information or an opinion about an identified, or reasonably identifiable, individual.

The Department of Agriculture collects your personal information in relation to this form for the purposes of assessing your application to register as an accredited property and related purposes. If you fail to provide some or all of the personal information requested in this form, the department will be unable to process your application.

The department may disclose your personal information to overseas governments or agencies, Australian diplomatic posts and Australian Government agencies, persons or organisations where necessary for the purposes described, provided the disclosure is consistent with relevant laws, particularly the Privacy Act. Your personal information will be used and stored in accordance with the Australian Privacy Principles.

By completing and submitting this form you consent to the disclosure of all personal information contained in this form to overseas governments and agencies and the National Plant Protection Organisation (NPPO) of each nominated importing country. The department has not taken steps to ensure that these parties do not breach the Australian Privacy Principles. This means that:
