

Application to renew a livestock export licence

Form approved under section 377(1)(b) of the Export Control Act 2020

Section A: General information

Purpose of this form

For the holder of a livestock export licence (a person in executive management of the export business) to apply to renew the licence.

To renew the licence with variations:

- select 'renew (with variations)' in Section B
- submit an Application to vary a livestock export licence, approved arrangement or approved export program with this application.

Before applying

Ensure you:

- submit your renewal application between 180 and 120 days before the licence expiry date (or longer if the Secretary allows). For example, if a licence is due to expire on 8 July, the renewal application must be made between 9 January and 10 March.
- read and understand the <u>livestock export licence</u> requirements
- understand the meaning of 'associate' as defined in section 13 of the Export Control Act 2020
- conduct the appropriate due diligence to support your responses to the fit and proper person test in Section D
- have the consent of the persons listed on the livestock export licence to provide their personal information to the department
- have notified those persons that their information will be handled in accordance with the Privacy notice.

Ensure that your approved arrangement and approved export program (if applicable) are current. Check that you have:

- addressed relevant changes to legislation or export standards such as the <u>Australian Standards</u> for the Export of Livestock
- submitted an <u>Application to vary a livestock export licence</u>, <u>approved arrangement or approved export program</u> to make other variations, such as to standard export plans or management plans, if required.
