I am writing in response to your various correspondence from the month of March relating to the Victorian Regional Forest Agreements (RFAs).

Finally, as you are aware, the 2019-20 bushfire season has significantly affected forested areas across the RFA regions of Victoria. It will be many months before the full impact of the fires can be assessed. Given this, I am seeking your agreement to undertake a Major Event Review of the RFAs at a suitable time following the signing of the modernised RFAs.

The draft modernised Victorian RFAs include provisions for a Major Event Review to be undertaken following a significant event (such as bushfires, floods and disease). These

reviews will be conducted by an independent panel and include opportunity for public consultation.

Details of a commencement date and funding allocation will be outlined in a jointly agreed Scoping Agreement between the Parties.

I have sent a copy of this letter to the Prime Minister, the Hon. David Littleproud MP, Minister for Agriculture, Drought and Emergency Management and the Hon. Sussan Ley MP, Minister for the Environment.



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# 1 Introduction

# 1.1. About the Victorian Regional Forest Agreements

The Victorian Regional Forest Agreements (RFAs) are long-term agreements between the Commonwealth Victorian governments that establish the framework for the sustainable management and conservation of forests in an RFA Region. Originally signed between 1997 and 2000 for a period of 20 years, the five RFAs for the Central Highlands, East Gippsland, Gippsland, North East and West Victoria regions were recently extended until 30 June 2020.

The main objectives of the Victorian RFAs are to provide for:

- a comprehensive, adequate and representative (CAR) reserve system
- the ecologically sustainable management and use of forested areas in each RFA Region, and
- the long-term stability of forests and forest industries.

The Parties are committed to ensuring that the obligations and commitments that the RFAs contain are delivered to ensure effective conservation, forest management and forestry industry outcomes.

# 1.2. The Major Event Review

As defined in the Victorian RFAs, a 'Major Event' is a substantial change in circumstances that has the potential to significantly impact upon:

- a) the objectives and operation of the RFAs;
- b) the comprehensiveness, adequacy or representativeness of the Comprehensive, Adequate and Representative (CAR) Reserve System;
- c) Ecologically Sustainable Forest Management (ESFM);
- d) one or more Matters of National Environment Significance (MNES); or
- e) the stability of Forest Industries.

within the RFA region, and includes (but is not limited to) natural events such as bushfires, floods and disease.

The 2019-20 bushfires have had devastating impacts on forests, biodiversity, forestry industries and regional communities. At the time of the Victorian RFA extensions in March 2020, detailed information on the extent of the damage on forests was not yet available. As part of the extension process, Senator the Hon. Jonathon Duniam, Assistant Minister for Forestry and Fisheries, and the Hon. Lily D'Ambrosio MP, Victorian Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change, agreed that a Major Event Review (MER) was warranted to assess the impacts on the operation of the RFAs.

The MER commences on signing of the Scoping Agreement, which outlines agreed arrangements for undertaking the review.

# 1.3. Purpose of this plan

The purpose of this plan is to guide the joint communications undertaken by the Victorian and Australian governments with stakeholders and the community.

# 1.4. Communications objectives

1. To **inform Victorian communities** of the MER process.

- 2. To ensure interested and impacted stakeholders and communities are aware of **opportunities to engage** in the MER process.
- 3. To ensure the community is aware of the **evidence based, independent review** which underpins the findings and recommendations of the MER.
- 4. To inform communities and stakeholders about the **recommendations** of, and the **government response** to the MER process.

# 1.5. Roles and responsibilities

Key roles and responsibilities in relation to communication activities for Victorian and Australian government agencies are outlined in the table below.

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# 2 Communication

# 2.1. Communication phases

For the purposes of this strategy there are 5 key phases for communication, with tasks and deliverables discussed further below.

- 1. Official announcement of the MER and release of the Scoping Agreement.
- 2. Publication of the Summary Report and promotion of consultation.
- 3. Public consultation activities.
- 4. Publication of the Panel's report.
- 5. Publication of the Joint Government Response (JGR) to the Panel's report.

# 2.2. Key messages

The following key messages should guide all written and verbal communications.

- The Victorian and Australian governments are committed to RFAs, which provide a framework for the continued sustainable management of the Victoria's forests and forest-based wildlife.
- The 2019-20 bushfires have had devastating impacts on forests, biodiversity, forestry industries and regional communities.
- The Australian and Victorian governments have agreed that, as a consequence of the 2019-20 bushfires in Victoria, a Major Event Review (MER) of the Victorian RFAs will be undertaken.
- The MER will be undertaken by an independent expert panel and informed by the best available information concerning the impacts of the bushfires on the RFA regions.
- As part of the MER process, there will be an opportunity for public consultation in late 2020.
- The Victorian and Australian governments encourage all interested parties to provide input into the MER during the public consultation period.

## 2.3. Communication activities & channels

Where possible, communication about the MER will be made through joint statements by the Parties. If either Party decides to make a separate public statement about the MER, the Parties agree that they will advise the other Party prior to making the statement.

### Websites

The DAWE website will be the Australian Government's primary channel for information on the MER. The DAWE website will include links to the DELWP website for relevant content. The DAWE website will also host the final Scoping Agreement, Panel's report and the JGR.

The DELWP website will be the Victorian Government's primary channel for information on the MER. The DELWP website will host the Summary Report and will host content related to public submissions.

### **Media releases**

As required, media releases can be used to announce major milestones in the MER and promote outcomes of the review process. Joint media releases will be developed where possible.

## Twitter / other social media

The DAWE and DELWP twitter accounts can be used to promote key messages, including to circulate media releases from relevant ministers.

# **Talking points**

Talking points will be developed for the respective Ministers. Where practical, talking points should be shared with the other party to ensure consistent messaging.

### **Advertising**

Subject to the agreement of the Parties, advertising might be undertaken to promote the MER public consultation process. Both parties will agree to the content in these advertisements and logos to be used will be at the government level, not departmental.

### **Emails to stakeholders**

DAWE, DELWP and DJPR will coordinate stakeholder lists prior to sending out notification of the release of the summary report, consultation, panels report and JGR – to minimize duplication and gaps in coverage.

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# 1 Introduction

## 1.1. About the Victorian Regional Forest Agreements

The Victorian Regional Forest Agreements (RFAs) are long-term agreements between the Commonwealth Victorian governments that establish the framework for the sustainable management and conservation of forests in an RFA Region. Originally signed between 1997 and 2000 for a period of 20 years, the five RFAs for the Central Highlands, East Gippsland, Gippsland, North East and West Victoria regions were recently extended until 30 June 2020.

The main objectives of the Victorian RFAs are to provide for:

- a comprehensive, adequate and representative (CAR) reserve system
- the ecologically sustainable management and use of forested areas in each RFA Region, and
- the long-term stability of forests and forest industries.

The Parties are committed to ensuring that the obligations and commitments that the RFAs contain are delivered to ensure effective conservation, forest management and forestry industry outcomes.

## 1.2. The Major Event Review

As defined in the Victorian RFAs, a 'Major Event' is a substantial change in circumstances that has the potential to significantly impact upon:

- a) the objectives and operation of the RFAs;
- b) the comprehensiveness, adequacy or representativeness of the Comprehensive, Adequate and Representative (CAR) Reserve System;
- c) Ecologically Sustainable Forest Management (ESFM);
- d) one or more Matters of National Environment Significance (MNES); or
- e) the stability of Forest Industries.

within the RFA region, and includes (but is not limited to) natural events such as bushfires, floods and disease.

The 2019-20 bushfires have had devastating impacts on forests, biodiversity, forestry industries and regional communities. At the time of the Victorian RFA extensions in March 2020, detailed information on the extent of the damage on forests was not yet available. As part of the extension process, Senator the Hon. Jonathon Duniam, Assistant Minister for Forestry and Fisheries, and the Hon. Lily D'Ambrosio MP, Victorian Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change, agreed that a Major Event Review (MER) was warranted to assess the impacts on the operation of the RFAs.

The MER commences on signing of the Scoping Agreement, which outlines agreed arrangements for undertaking the review.

### 1.3. Purpose of this plan

The purpose of this plan is to guide the joint communications undertaken by the Victorian and Australian governments with stakeholders and the community.

### 1.4. Communications objectives

1. To inform Victorian communities of the MER process.

- 2. To ensure interested and impacted stakeholders and communities are aware of **opportunities to engage** in the MER process.
- 3. To ensure the community is aware of the **evidence based, independent review** which underpins the findings and recommendations of the MER.
- 4. To inform communities and stakeholders about the **recommendations** of, and the **government response** to the MER process.

Further to last week's JWG meeting. Please find attached updated info gap analysis following my further cross-check with the document provided by the Cth on Friday 12 June.

The only missing information I could find was the Cth's proposed inclusion of information sources for item 2 "Impacts on operation of RFAs and ESFM". As the information items Cth proposed to be included in that section were high level existing documents (the RFAs and their supporting documents; the RFA Act) and the focus of the gap analysis was to identify specific information available and needs for the ME Review, I had not included it in the gap analysis I provided for the last JWG. However, these information sources are relevant and I have now inserted them into the attached document.

I note that in keeping with the document's current purpose as a gap analysis, we agreed at the JWG not to include the Cth's proposed additional columns around "How will this info/data inform the MER?" and "Access". However, I have brought Cth's proposed content for the "How will this info/data inform the MER?" column into the body of the table.

If there are areas where Vic has identified information items and the Cth considers the rationale or use is not clear, I would appreciate your specific query at the relevant item. The updated document has sought to clarify such queries raised by the Cth previously.

Otherwise, from my review, all other content and items for discussion from the Cth's document were brought into this document previously either in the body of the tables or if addressed otherwise, this has been explained in the comments/responses on the document.

If there is something that the Cth considers has not been included or is inaccurate, I would appreciate your specific comments or edits for consideration. I am happy to step through the document and edits on the phone if that is helpful to address any queries.

I look forward to receiving your advice on any remaining queries/comments or confirmation that the Cth is comfortable for this document to be circulated to the JWG.

### Dear Minister

Thank you for your letter of 28 June 2020 regarding the proposed funding of activities to support the Major Event Review of the Victorian Regional Forest Agreements (RFAs).

I acknowledge the work that Victoria has undertaken after the 2019-20 bushfires and I am pleased that Victoria will be bringing such a wide range of information to the review. The Australian Government is also providing significant funding to Victoria in the wake of the 2019-20 bushfire season. This includes \$10.25 million, to undertake a wide range of activities, from fire impact assessments of rainforest, to feral animal control, threatened species management and forestry transport assistance. This funding is in addition to other support the government is providing nationally, which will also be relevant for Victoria, including the \$150 million bushfire recovery for wildlife and their habitats.

I understand that Victorian officials are yet to provide the Commonwealth officials with feedback on the latest version of the draft Scoping Agreement, which we will need to agree at a ministerial level prior to commencing the review. I would like to see this Major Event Review get underway especially considering the length of time that has passed since the fires and these negotiations have been ongoing for months. I would welcome your assistance in ensuring we can undertake the Major Event Review as soon as possible.

I understand officials are also identifying a range of data that will be required for the review. I anticipate that while there may be some information the government may agree to co-fund, there will be other information that should be being collected as part of the State's normal forest management activities in order to maintain their Forest Management System as accredited by the RFAs. For example, I consider that mapping of rainforest extent and forest classification remain the responsibility of the State Government.

I therefore cannot confirm that the government will provide equal funding for any new information until the Parties have had time to consider the merits of each case.

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The government will of course share the costs of those activities that we agree are required for conducting the review as agreed in the RFAs. This agreement extends to any information that the Panel requests and the Parties agree to.

With respect to funding for the review Panel, I propose that the Parties co-fund the Commonwealth-selected independent panel member and the other member(s) as agreed by the Parties, noting they are likely to be Traditional Owner representatives. I would not expect that the Victorian Commissioner for Environmental Sustainability will require additional funding with respect to this review as this activity would surely fall within the responsibilities of the Commissioner's role.

I have sent a copy of this letter to the Hon. Sussan Ley MP, Minister for the Environment, and the Hon. Jaclyn Symes MLC, Minister for Agriculture.
