Policy Decision 21-04

National approach to Ehrlichia canis (E. canis) management

Animal Health Committee

Recommendations

- 1) Nationally co-ordinated public information campaign promoting:
 - a) Awareness of *E. canis* and management of the vector
 - b) Guidelines for dog owners and breeders with dogs travelling or moving into/through areas where *E. canis* is known or likely to be active or where the vector is known to be present
 - c) Guidelines (promoted as protective biosecurity measures) for dog owners, breeders and rehoming organisations with dogs travelling or moving out of areas where *E. canis* is known or likely to be active to areas where *E. canis* is not established

Messaging should be simple and in language appropriate to meet stakeholder communication needs.

2) National guidelines for veterinarians investigating and managing cases of *E. canis*, including information for dog owners on long-term management of *E. canis*.

Additional recommendations where 'infection with *E. canis*' is listed as a nationally notifiable disease or notifiable under jurisdictional legislation:

- a) Passive surveillance program in areas where *E. canis* is not known to be active
- b) Active exclusion testing for suspect cases in areas where *E. canis* is not active or known to be active
- c) National data management and reporting for *E. canis* surveillance through NAHIS.
