I live in a remote regional town that has most of its income from agricultural (horticultural, fishing and pastoral) and tourism.

Why are international backpackers important and probably a question that gets asked in tandem why can't labour be sought from Australian workers? Simply the nature of the two industry groups revolves around seasonal work and the industries mainly due to climatic impact (very hot summers) cannot sustain a 12 month employment cycle.

What does the backpacker tax mean to our community? The global backpacker market is competitive; if Australia has an unattractive tax environment international visitor workers will go elsewhere – simple. If we cannot find seasonal workers businesses will fail
