# PLANT QUARANTINE POLICY BRANCH: UPDATE ON IMPORT RISK ANALYSES

This Plant Quarantine Policy Memorandum (PQPM) provides a list of import access proposals received by AQIS. It also contains a status report on the Branch's import risk analysis (IRA) work program and describes changes to the presentation of correspondence to the form of PQPMs.

#### **Current import access proposals**

Each year AQIS receives many proposals to import agricultural commodities. AQIS maintains a register of these requests and as resources become available the highest priority requests are commenced. In deciding priority, AQIS takes into account factors such as the availability of data, the order of receipt of proposals, the breadth and nature of interest in the establishment of new or revised conditions, the need to consider access by a particular date, as well as stakeholder comment. The current list of import access proposals is at Attachment A. Stakeholders may now offer information and comment on the priority they consider should be accorded by AQIS to each proposal.

#### **Current IRA work program**

A list of the Branch's current IRA work program is provided at Attachment B. Currently there are 19 plant and grain IRAs under way. A determination has been made in two of these IRAs but the application of import policy is pending the outcome of the appeal process. There have been delays in the process for some IRAs for a variety of reasons, some of which are identified in comments provided in the attached document.

#### The change to Plant Quarantine Policy Memorandums.

To ensure consistency between the Plant and Animal Quarantine Policy Branches of AQIS in conducting IRAs, the format for providing information on plant issues to stakeholders will be changed. Stakeholders have until now received personally addressed letters regarding the process for each IRA. Commencing with this document a numbered memoranda series called Plant Quarantine Policy Memorandums (PQPMs) will be introduced. This change in format will not reduce the amount of information provided to stakeholders.

Allium (R)	Letter of 2 July 1999 on determination on type of process. Risk Analysis being conducted.	Release of draft IRA has been delayed as AQIS is progressing work on other IRAs that are considered a higher priority. Draft due for release in December 2000.
Apples, NZ (R)	Letter of 29 June 1999 on determination on type of process. Risk Analysis being conducted.	Release of draft IRA expected in May 2000.
Bulbs, Ornamental (NR)	Letter of 30 March 1999 distributing issues paper. Risk Analysis being conducted.	Draft IRA delayed due to the need to replace the chair of the RAP and three members of the TWG. Release of draft IRA expected in June 2000.
