POLICY DETERMINATION

ON THE IMPORTATION OF FRESH STONE FRUIT FROM CALIFORNIA, IDAHO, OREGON AND WASHINGTON IN THE USA

This is my determination relating to the biosecurity policy for the importation of fresh stone fruit from the four designated export states in the USA.

The importation of fresh stone fruit from four designated export states in the USA may be permitted, subject to the *Quarantine Act 1908* and the application of phytosanitary measures as specified in the *Final import risk analysis report for fresh stone fruit from California, Idaho, Oregon and Washington*. These measures are designed to limit quarantine risk to a level which achieves Australia's appropriate level of protection.

This policy is to be taken into account by decision makers when considering import permit applications for fresh stone fruit from the USA in accordance with the *Quarantine Act 1908* and *Quarantine Proclamation 1998* as amended.
