Further to Market Access Advice 2016-05, the Department of Agriculture and Water Resources provides the following information to clarify the categories of dairy products which, in accordance with the requirements of the *Special Act on Imported Food Safety Management*, Australia are **not approved** for export to the Republic of Korea (Korea).

The following dairy products categories are currently **not approved** to be exported to Korea until further notice:

Product Category	Products (unofficial translation and for guidance only)	Definition (unofficial translation and for guidance only)
Non-fat milk	including non-fat milk, restored non-fat milk, fortified non-fat milk, ultra-heat-treated (UHT), extended shelf life (ESL), restored fortified non-fat milk and lactic acid bacteria-added non-fat milk	Non-fat milk, is milk that has a fat content of ≤ 0.5 %
Hydrolyzed lactose milk	including hydrolyzed lactose milk, low-fat hydrolyzed lactose milk and non-fat hydrolyzed milk	Hydrolysed lactose milk, is milk where lactose has been hydrolysed with a lactose hydylosing enzyme or physically removed.
Processed milks	including processed milk, low-fat processed milk, skimmed processed milk, and milk beverages	Processed milks are products that have dairy as the main ingredient, but have had other foods or food additives added prior to pasteurization or sterilization.
Goats milk	N/A	Pasteurised or sterilised milk obtained from goats
Ice cream mixes	including ice cream mix, ice milk mix, sherbet mix, low-fat ice cream mix, non-milk fat ice cream mix	Ice cream mixes in a liquid state, that have dairy ingredients as the main ingredient and other food or food additives included followed by sterilisation.

The department is currently working with Korea to confirm access for processed milks, non-fat milk and ice cream mixes; however, until further notice, these products are unable to be exported to Korea.

Certification for dairy products

Certification will remain available for all Australian dairy products; however, trade in these products from establishments not approved by Korea's Ministry of Food and Drug Safety or without a history of trade to Korea occurs at commercial risk. Exporters are encouraged to work with their importers to confirm product eligibility prior to export.
